## Grand Forks is site of Governor's Committee on Aging Forum on April 20

BISMARCK, ND - The Governor's Committee on Aging is inviting residents of the Grand Forks region to attend a public forum Monday, April 20, 2009, 11:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. at the Grand Forks Senior Center, 620 4<sup>th</sup> Ave. S. The forum is one of seven scheduled in communities across North Dakota this April featuring national and in-state experts on health promotion and disease prevention, and other issues related to living and aging well and maintaining independence.

"The North Dakota Governor's Forums on Aging are intended to be learning opportunities for seniors and others interested in issues related to aging," said Committee Chairman Amy Clark. "We are very pleased that Capt.
