Temporary License & Drive-Out Permits

I am from out-of-state working in North Dakota. How do I get a permit to work in your state?

Temporary license may be purchased by non-residents. They are available from the North Dakota Highway Patrol or any Motor Vehicle Division office. License may be purchased on a monthly basis for as many months needed up to one year. License must be displayed on the vehicle windshield. Fees are based on type of vehicle being registered. http://www.dot.nd.gov/divisions/mv/mvschedule.htm

What are the fees for a temporary license?

Pursuant to Section 39-04-21 of the North Dakota Century Code (NDCC), the following flat fees are implemented for a temporary monthly vehicle registration:

Trailers (does not include travel trailers): \$5 per month plus \$3 permit fee.

Travel trailers: \$20 fee plus \$3 permit fee.

Passenger vehicles: \$10 per month plus \$3 permit fee.

<u>Trucks</u>: Registered Gross Vehicle Weight less than 22,000 lbs: \$10 per month plus \$3 permit fee.

Vehicles requiring a registered gross weight of 22,000 lbs or greater are pro-rated at 1/12 the annual fee times the number of months requested with a minimum fee of \$5, plus a \$3 permit fee.

I purchased a vehicle in North Dakota. How do I get it to my home state to register?

An out-of-state resident who purchases a vehicle in our state can obtain a Drive Out permit from the North Dakota Highway Patrol or any Motor Vehicle Division office. The permit is valid for 30 days from date of issue, must be displayed in the window of the vehicle, and allows the individual to drive the vehicle from our state to their home of record state. The fee is \$5.00.
