The Smithsonian Chamber Music Society celebrates its 32nd season with performances of musical masterpieces from the late 17th century to the 20th century.

Presented through the Smithsonian Associates, the Smithsonian Chamber Music Society will offer two special series: "Masterworks of Five Centuries" and "The Axelrod Quartet." The SCMS, in residence at the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History, will perform in the Renwick Gallery of the Smithsonian American Art Museum. One hour before each performance, SCMS artistic director Kenneth Slowik will hold pre-concert lectures.
