

Executive Order 2009-09

WHEREAS, I have declared a statewide flood emergency because of excessive fall rains and severe winter and spring storms; and

WHEREAS, community members and local governments are coordinating and assisting flood-fight efforts with State and Federal authorities; which include construction, preservation and maintenance of dikes and levees necessary to protect life and property; and

WHEREAS, the Red River has reached record levels in Fargo and surrounding communities, which is threatening the homes and safety of many North Dakota people.

WHEREAS, based upon these factors, actions are necessary to address threats to public health and safety, reduce economic hardships, and continue response, recovery and mitigation efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, John Hoeven, Governor of North Dakota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article V, Section 1 of the North Dakota Constitution and North Dakota Century Code § 37-17.1, do hereby declare that a state of emergency exists in North Dakota that requires relief from North Dakota Century Code chapter 12.1-30 pertaining to Sunday closing laws, otherwise known as "Blue Laws."

This order is issued on the foregoing bases and on the following conditions:

- 1. Nothing in this order shall be construed to suspend N.D.C.C. § 34-06-05.1 allowing an employee at least one period of twenty-four consecutive hours of time off for rest or worship in each seven-day period.
- 2. Businesses not selling or renting items related to flood-fighting activities should remain closed.

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This order shall be effective immediately and remain in effect until 12:01 p.m. CDT March 29, 2009, or for the duration of the emergency, whichever is less.
