Two Establishments Cited for Selling to Minors

KANKAKEE – Two Kankakee establishments were cited Monday for liquor license violations after they allegedly sold alcohol to minors as part of an undercover operation conducted by Illinois Liquor Control Commission (ILCC) agents and Illinois State Police.

During the operation, two of 21 establishments checked sold alcohol to underage minors, including:

Kankakee Liquor Store 1680 W. Station St

Marycrest Lanes 1931 E. Court St.

All were referred to the Illinois Liquor Control Commission for action. The penalties for selling alcohol to minors can include fines and/or liquor license suspension or revocation.

"Under-age drinking is a serious problem, and our licensees know the rules," said Lainie Krozel, Executive Director of the ILCC. "They should be checking the IDs of these kids."

The undercover operations are part of ongoing statewide checks made throughout the year to assure compliance with the law that prohibits the sale of alcohol to minors.
