Benefit of Electronic Filing

Illinois taxpayers should take advantage of the speed, ease, accuracy and security of electronic filing. Electronic filers avoid mistakes because the department's software automatically corrects errors online. They get fast refunds and a confirmation number to prove they filed. Paper filers will wait up to 12 weeks for their refund, but those who use I-File with direct deposit will receive their refunds in about a week.

Internet Help

Taxpayers can find answers to many of their filing season questions on the department's web site at <u>www.Iltax.com</u>. They can download forms, access frequently asked questions, check on the status of refunds, pay electronically, get more detailed information on bills and taxpayer notices or even file their return through I-File.

Common Taxpayer Filing Errors to Avoid

- 1. Claiming the Education Expense Credit for college; credit applies only to K through 12
- 2. Filing only one page when the return is on two sheets of paper
- 3. Failing to attach all W-2s
- 4. Failing to attach U.S. 1040 if retirement income is subtracted
- 5. Failing to sign return
- 6. If using TeleFile, not completing worksheet before calling IDOR
- 7. If using direct deposit, using incorrect account number or bank routing number

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
