Jean Shin is nationally recognized for her monumental installations that transform castoff materials into elegant expressions of identity and community. The exhibition "Jean Shin: Common Threads" will be on view at the Smithsonian American Art Museum May 1 through July 26. It features eight works created since 2000, including the new site-specific installation "Everyday Monuments" commissioned by the museum. The museum is the only venue for the exhibition.

Shin's most recent project, "Everyday Monuments," debuts in this exhibition. This major work consists of nearly 2,000 trophies donated by Washington, D.C.-area residents and projected images of the altered trophies. The trophies are arranged according to a scale plan of the National Mall, symbolically filling the expanse of Washington's signature public space.
