The National Portrait Gallery presents a day of programs for friends, families and art lovers of all ages that celebrate the art of Marcel Duchamp and Duchamp's influence on Andy Warhol. It will be a special opportunity for visitors to explore and better understand the exhibition "Inventing Marcel Duchamp: The Dynamics of Portraiture," currently on view on the second floor of the museum. Programs will include an arts-and-crafts station; a children's book reading with Andy Warhol's nephew, James Warhola, author of "Uncle Andy's: A Faabbbulous Visit with Andy Warhol" and "Uncle Andy's Cats"; gallery talks with cocurator James W. McManus and John W. Smith; screenings with Callie Angell of selections from Warhol's "Screen Tests"; and an interview with the New Yorker art critic Calvin Tomkins.
