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Federal stimulus help with health insurance costs

(Salem) — Oregonians who lost jobs in recent months will find information on the Oregon Insurance Division Web site that explains who qualifies for federal stimulus help paying health insurance premiums. For eligible Oregonians, help paying insurance premiums starts March 1. People who qualify pay 35 percent of the health insurance premium. Their previous employer pays 65 percent of the cost and will be reimbursed by the federal government. The help is for up to nine months or up to six months, depending on the size of the employer.

People may be eligible for a full or partial subsidy based on the timing of their job loss, their income and whether their employer remains in business and still offers health insurance.
