2009 DOE/NNSA Annual Integrated Safety Management (ISM) Workshop Goes International

This year, the 2009 DOE/NNSA Annual Integrated Safety Management (ISM) workshop will include representatives from Sellafield Laboratories in the United Kingdom and the Chalk River Labs of Atomic Energy of Canada. This years workshop will be held on August 24-27,2009, at the <u>Knoxville Convention Center</u> in Knoxville, Tennessee. The Workshop is <u>sponsored</u> by the DOE Oak Ridge Office and the National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA) Y-12 Site Office. The workshop's keynote speaker will be <u>Pat Summitt</u>, head basketball coach of the University of Tennessee Lady Volunteers, and featured speaker will be <u>Gen. Fred Roggero</u>, U.S. Air Force Chief of Safety. The 10 technical tracks will include traditional ISM areas, such as work planning and control, Environmental Management Systems, Feedback and Improvements Processes, as well as new topics, such as Safety of Work Created under the 2009 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA); Employee Health and Wellness; and Quality Assurance.

Senior DOE and NNSA leadership and a DNFSB member will be addressing the workshop participants. There will be over 70 vendor booths at this year's workshop with a wide range of ES&H information. To further support the topic of Wellness and Health, there will be a booth from the Mayo Clinic. There will be designated breaks in the afternoon to allow all workshop participants the opportunity to visit the vendors' booths and hold discussions with their technical representatives.
