Pilot program for Segway use approved

BART's Board of Directors has approved a one-year pilot program for the use of Segways and other Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices (EPAMD) on the BART system.

To use a Segway or similar device on BART, please apply for one of the limited



number of free permits. BART will require permit holders to follow a few simple rules to address safety and crowding concerns.

Avoid a ticket, steer clear of bus zones

Avoid big fines by keeping bus zones at BART stations clear for their intended users: buses.

Curb space authorized for the loading and unloading of passengers of a bus (indicated by a sign or red paint on the curb) must be left open for buses. No stopping or parking is allowed in these zones.

Look for the signs or red curbs and keep moving. You'll keep your money, instead of paying a ticket, too.
