BART bike lockers go electric

Electronic bike lockers provide secure bike parking and increased bicycle storage capacity at BART stations. Approximately 200 lockers are currently available throughout the BART system and more are on the way.

The second phase of BART's electronic locker program will provide additional electronic lockers at 16 stations this year.

To use the electronic lockers, buy a smart card online or at a convenient vendor location.

BART Bike Rules

For complete BART Bike Rules, pick up a "BART Basics Guide" or visit bart.gov/bikes.

- Bikes are allowed on all trains except those trains shown in highlighted areas of the "BART Fares and Schedules" brochure.
- Regardless of any other rule, bikes are never allowed on crowded cars. Bikes are allowed in any car but the first car of a train.
- · Bicyclists must use elevator or stairs, not escalators, and always walk bikes.
- Bicyclists under 14 years old must be accompanied by an adult.
- Bikes must be parked in racks and lockers. Bikes parked against poles, fences or railings will be removed.

Embarcadero elevator repairs begin this month

Beginning May 4, repairs begin at the Embarcadero station elevator located near California and Drumm Streets. This elevator will be closed from May until August 2009. Customers who rely on elevators to access the Embarcadero station should use Montgomery Station as an alternative.

In September, the Montgomery Street station elevator at Sutter and Sansome will be closed for repairs and the Powell Street station elevator at Stockton and Ellis will be closed beginning in January 2010.
