ORDER**KOZINSKI**, Chief Judge:

A complaint of misconduct has been filed against a bankruptcy judge. Complainant, a pro se debtor, previously filed a complaint of misconduct against the subject judge; that complaint was dismissed by the chief circuit judge. The current complaint merely repeats the allegations raised in the prior complaint. Complainant has attached several new exhibits, but they do not support his allegations of misconduct. The chief judge's prior order makes further action on this complaint unnecessary. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(2).

Complainant is cautioned that further misconduct complaints based on the same essential facts may result in sanctions or an order directing the clerk not to file any further complaints. See Misconduct Rule 1(g).
