A Message from Attorney General Tom Corbett



The Dog Purchaser Protection Act, Section 9.3, is an amendment to the Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law.

The amendment was effective on August 25, 1997. The law establishes basic standards that dog sellers, dog purchasers, veterinarians and any other party subject to this provision must meet.

This section, as well as the Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law, is enforced by my Bureau of Consumer Protection.

A civil penalty of up to \$1,000 may be levied against any person who violates any provision of this section, and up to \$2,000 against any seller who conducts business under this section without a proper license.

- **Q.** Is a Veterinarian's Certification of illness, congenital or hereditary defects or death necessary for a purchaser to get a refund?
- **A.** Yes, and not only for the purchaser to get a refund, but for a replacement puppy or even for reimbursement of veterinary costs.
- **Q.** Who will pay for the Veterinarian's Certification?
- **A.** The purchaser will bear the expense of the Veterinarian's Certification.
