Umpqua Basin Fish Passage Restoration – #39

Need: Habitat restoration is needed to support the Endangered Species Act listed Oregon Coast coho salmon and other aquatic species in the Umpqua Basin.

The project entails replacing five culverts in five different areas outside of Roseburg in Douglas County. The projects will restore more than three miles of habitat access for the coho salmon.

Recovery Act Funding: Work will begin immediately after the contract has been awarded and will continue for the next 12 to 18 months creating 3 to 4 jobs.

Local sub-contractors will be needed for site survey, engineering, design, heavy equipment operations, and site inspections.

Additionally, agreements with local watershed councils will be established to manage the project.

Benefits: This project will allow coho salmon to access historically important habitat for spawning and rearing as well as support habitat for steelhead and cutthroat trout, and Pacific lamprey.
