#### **Project Description:**

The Environmental Sciences Division (<http://www.esd.ornl.gov/>) at Oak Ridge National Laboratory is opening a position for a Bioenergy Feedstock Analyst. The successful applicant will be responsible for compiling and analyzing experimental data on bioenergy feedstocks with respect to environmental factors and ecological gradients. Completed analyses will contribute to national assessments of feedstock. The successful applicant will be expected to communicate results in public forums and through peer-reviewed publications.

#### **Qualifications: Ph.D. degree required**

Applicants should hold a Doctoral degree in Agronomy, Plant Science, Soil Science, Environmental Science, or some related discipline in the field of natural resources. Preference will be given to applicants with experience in data base development, meta-analysis, ecological modeling, GIS/spatial modeling, and with agronomic field and laboratory experience.

Required Disciplines: Earth and Geosciences, Mathematics and Statistics, Chemistry

Review of applications will begin February 1, 2008.

Applicants cannot have received the most recent degree more than five years prior to the date of application and must complete all degree requirements before starting their appointment.
