**SUMMARY**: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 56) issued by the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") in the above-captioned investigation extending the target date for completion of the investigation by ten days. Furthermore, the Commission has determined to extend the target date an additional fourteen days, to establish a new target date of November 12, 2009, and to extend the date by which the Commission must determine whether to review the final ID to September 11, 2009.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION**: This investigation was instituted on December 19, 2007, based on a complaint filed by FormFactor, Inc. ("FormFactor") of Livermore, California. The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain probe card assemblies, components thereof, and certain tested DRAM and NAND flash memory devices and products containing same by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 5,994,152; 6,509,751; 6,615,485; 6,624,648; 7,168,162; and 7,225,538. The complaint named Micronics Japan Co., Ltd.; MJC Electronics Corp.; Phicom Corporation; and Phiam Corporation as respondents.

On June 11, 2009, the ALJ issued the subject ID extending the target date for completion of the investigation by ten days, or until October 29, 2009. No petitions for review were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID.

The Commission has also determined to extend the target date by an additional fourteen days, to November 12, 2009, and to extend the date by which the Commission must determine whether to review the final ID to September 11, 2009.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42 and 210.51 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. §§ 210.42, 210.51).
