1	The Services have completed the majority of their lists of projects for Facility, Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization (FSRM) in coordination with the Office of the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (DOUSD) (Installations & Environment) and the Do Inspector General. Air Force and NavyMarine Corps completed their FSRM projects lists while the Army continues to review remaining FSRM project requirements. Following OMB review, On 20 March 2009, DoD transmitted the ARRA report to Congress which included 3,306 FSRM projects identified to date: 1,473 for Army; 143 for Navy & Marine Corps; 1535 for Air Force; and 155 for Other Defense Agencies. For the 56 projects > \$7.5 million each that required Congressional Notification under 10 USC 2811, DoD transmitted the notification via the 20 March 2009 ARRA Report to Congress.	Continue review of National Environmental Protection Act/National Historic Preservation Act status on all recovery act projects.				
2	The Services have completed their Military Construction project lists in coordination with OUDSU (Installations : Environment) and the DoD Inspector General. These 122 Military Construction projects included 43 Army; 44 Navy & Marine Corps; 27 Air Force; and 8 Other Defense Agencies. Following OMB review, these were transmitted to Congress in the 20 March 2009 ARRA Report.	Distribute ARRA Federal Acquisition Regulation contract clauses for all ARRA related contracts after Defense Procurement and Acquisition Policy office approval.				
3	The Office of Management and Budget approved the DoD Recovery Act plan for all appropriations and authorized DoD to release our recovery act plan to Congress on 20 March 2009.	DoD will issue additional guidance on project execution and reporting requirements as developed by cross functional working group.				
	The Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Installations and Housing hosted an initial meeting of the Housing					
	Assistance Program (HAP) Task Force with primary mission to draft HAP implementing guidance.	DoD will submit the remaining Army FSRM projects to Congress within the next two weeks.
