GPO LAUNCHES PUBLICATION ALERT SYSTEM

WASHINGTON— The U.S. Government Printing Office (GPO) has launched an enhanced e-mail alert system to inform the public about new Government publications available for sale. Subscribers can select from more than 100 different subject areas. GPO provides this free notification service through GovDelivery, an e-mail service provider specializing in Government-to-citizen communications. This new system enables GPO to reach out to other agencies to get its alert service on their sites. For example, if someone is looking at NASA's Web site, he or she can sign up for the e-mail alert for NASA publications sold by GPO. Nearly 60,000 subscribers have signed up for the service.

"GPO's core mission is to keep Americans informed on the documents of our democracy," said Public Printer Bob Tapella. "This system is another way for GPO to carry out its historic mission. A simple e-mail alert will let the public know about the various publications available from our agency customers."

The GPO is the Federal Government's primary centralized resource for gathering, cataloging, producing, providing, authenticating, and preserving published U.S. Government information in all its forms. GPO is responsible for the production and distribution of information products and services for all three Branches of the Federal Government. In addition to publication sales, GPO makes Government information available at no cost to the public through GPO Access (www.gpoaccess.gov), and through partnerships with approximately 1,250 libraries nationwide participating in the Federal Depository Library Program.
