Notice of Modifications

The table below details the revisions made to the CTCAE v3.0 since its initial publication on March 31, 2003 through August 9, 2006. The revisions include minor editorial corrections and adjustments to Grade 5 definitions for several Adverse Events. The only significant change is the inclusion of 'Euphoria' under Mood alteration – *Select* in the NEUROLOGY CATEGORY and 'Blood' under the General subcategory within the INFECTION CATEGORY for the following Supra-ordinate terms:

- Infection (documented clinically or microbiologically) with Grade 3 or 4 neutrophils Select
- Infection with normal ANC or Grade 1 or 2 neutrophils *Select*
- Infection with unknown ANC Select

The **Publish Date** column indicates the CTCAE document Publish Date in which the revision occurred.

Please note that the CTCAE v3.0 document now includes the Publish Date of August 9, 2006. The previous CTCAE v3.0 documents published on March 31, April 16, June 10, and December 12, 2003 are obsolete and should no longer be used.
