Fatal work injuries involving Hispanic or Latino workers increased in 2004 after having declined the previous 2 years. Increases were recorded for both native-born and foreign-born Hispanic workers in 2004.

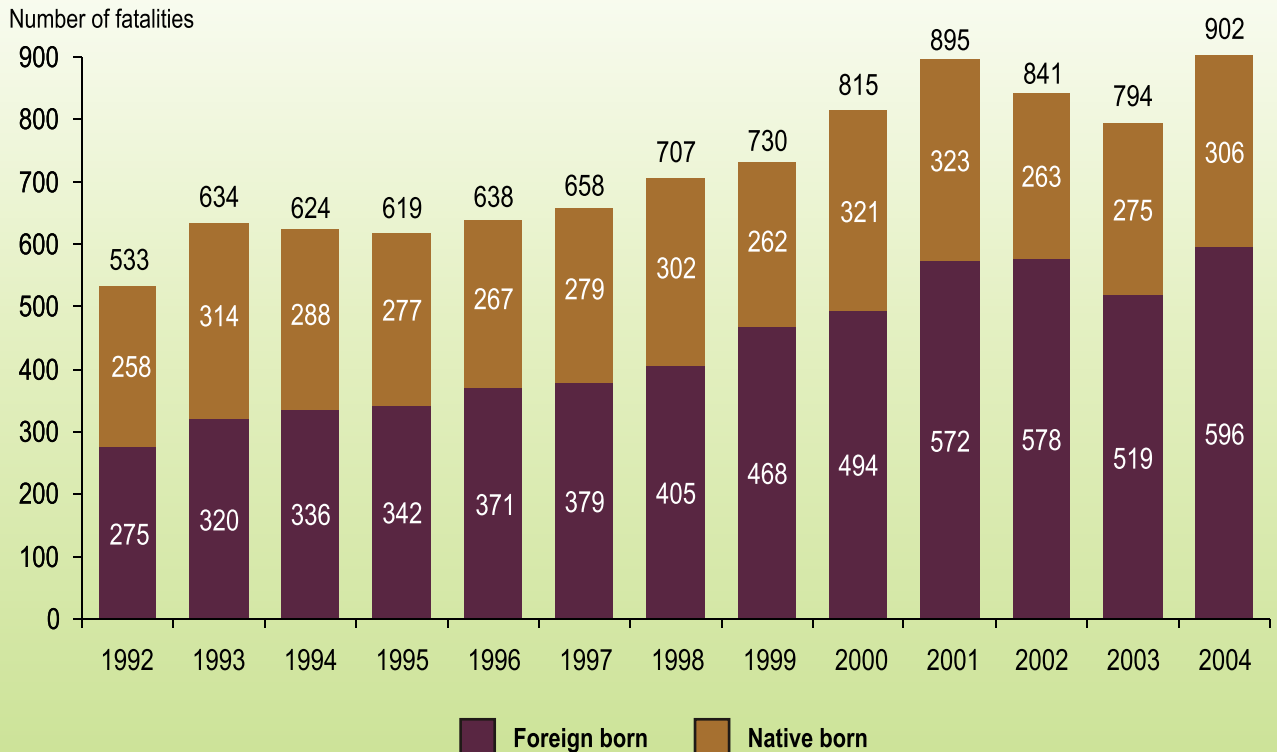
On average, about 60 percent of the Hispanic or Latino workers who died on the job were foreign born.

The number of fatal work injuries to Hispanic or Latino workers in 2004 was 69 percent higher than it was in 1992.
