Multiple-fatality incidents are defined as single incidents in which two or


more workers were fatally injured. In 2006, 518 workers, representing 9 percent of all fatal work injuries, were

killed in multiple-fatality incidents.

Transportation incidents accounted for 61 percent of the workers killed in multiple-fatality incidents. Fatal injuries resulting from homicides accounted for another 14 percent of

these fatalities.
