

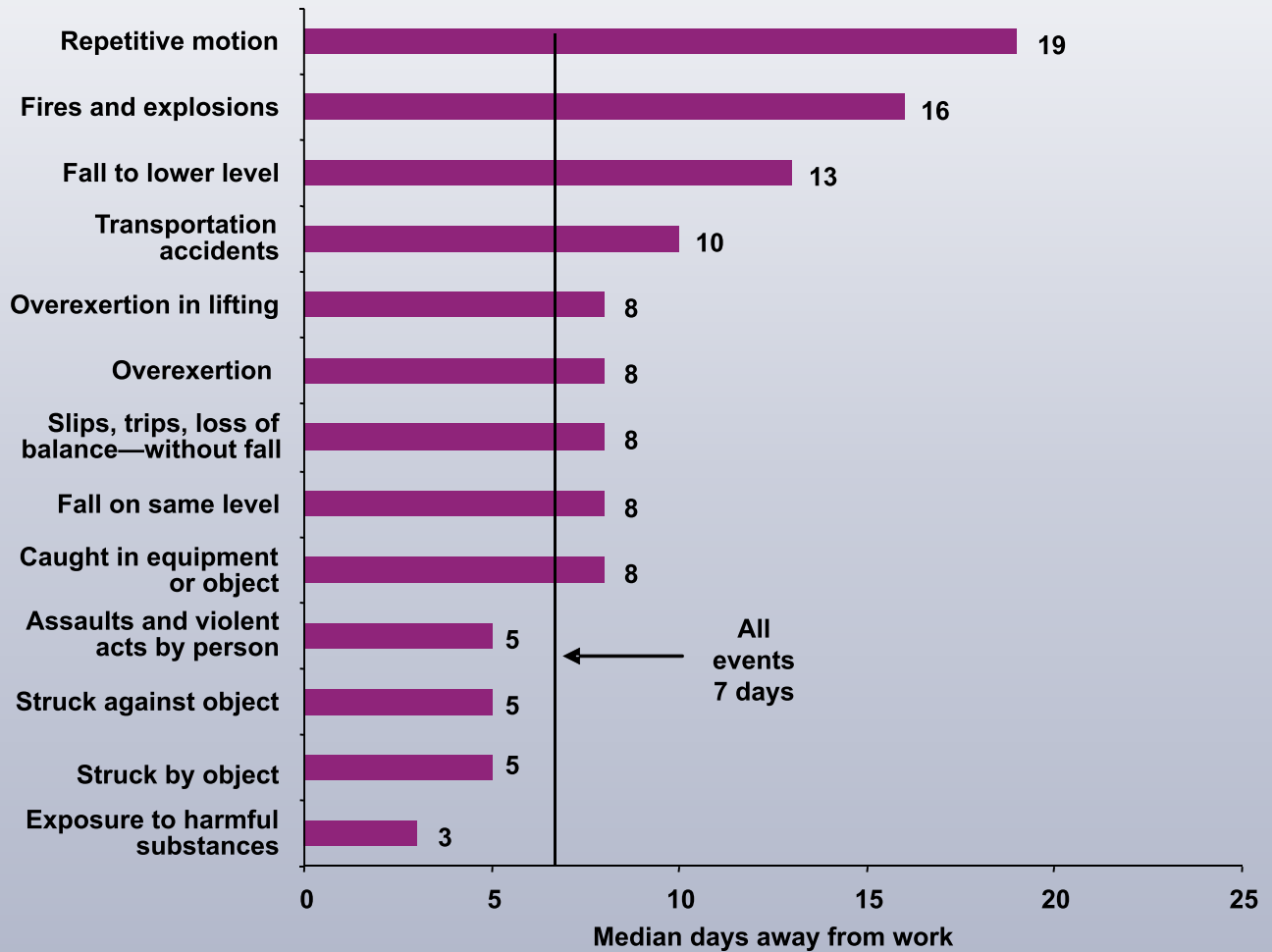

Repetitive motion, with a median of 19 days, resulted in the longest absences from work among leading events and exposures, followed by fires and explosions, with 16 days, and falls to a lower level, with 13 days.

From 2004 to 2005, the median number of days away from work declined by 1 day for repetitive motion injuries and falls to a lower level.
