

Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge Public Use Regulations

The Refuge is Open During Daylight Hours Only



Dogs and other pets must remain on a leash and under control so that they do not disturb wildlife or visitors.



Boats with electric motors and handpowered craft only.



Wisconsin's inland waters fishing regulations apply.



Vehicles must remain on established roadways.



Bicycles are allowed on established roadways.



Collecting mushrooms, nuts and berries for personal use is allowed. However, collecting natural objects such as plants, animals, antlers and objects of antiquity is prohibited.



Camping is available at Perrot State park and other nearby areas, camping on the refuge is prohibited.



Fires are not allowed.



Carrying, possessing or discharging firearms or any other weapons on the refuge is prohibited, except by licensed and permitted hunters engaged in authorized activities during established seasons.



Horses are prohibited because they can destroy habitat and damage trails and roads.



Off-road vehicles, including snowmobiles, trail bikes and all terrain vehicles are not allowed on any portion of the refuge.



Certain portions of the refuge are closed to entry at all times.
