Leopold Wetland Management District



The Leopold Wetland Management District is named after Aldo Leopold who is widely acknowledged as the father of wildlife conservation in America. Leopold is perhaps best known as the author of *A Sand County Almanac*, a book compiled of essays written on his farm in central Wisconsin. In tribute to his philosophy, the Leopold Wetland Management District is dedicated to preserving, restoring, and enhancing wildlife habitat in Wisconsin for the benefit of present and future generations.

The Leopold Wetland Management District manages over 12,000 acres of Waterfowl Production Areas (WPAs). WPAs are purchased with proceeds from the sales of Federal Duck Stamps and are owned by the Federal government. The lands are managed as part of the National Wildlife Refuge System, which is administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Wetlands on WPAs are restored and maintained for the benefit of migratory birds and other wildlife. Uplands are restored to grasslands, generally planted with native prairie grasses and forbs to provide nesting habitat or planted to crops through farming agreements for wildlife food plots.

Partners for Fish & Wildlife Program

Partners for Fish & Wildlife is a stewardship program for the restoration and protection of wetlands and other wildlife habitats on privately owned lands. Leopold Wetland Management District can offer you technical and financial assistance.

Things to Enjoy on WPAs

Waterfowl Production Areas are open to hunting, trapping, and fishing subject to all applicable Federal and State laws, except where posted with "Closed to Public Hunting" signs.

All WPAs are open to wildlife observation, hiking, cross-country skiing, nature study, and photography.

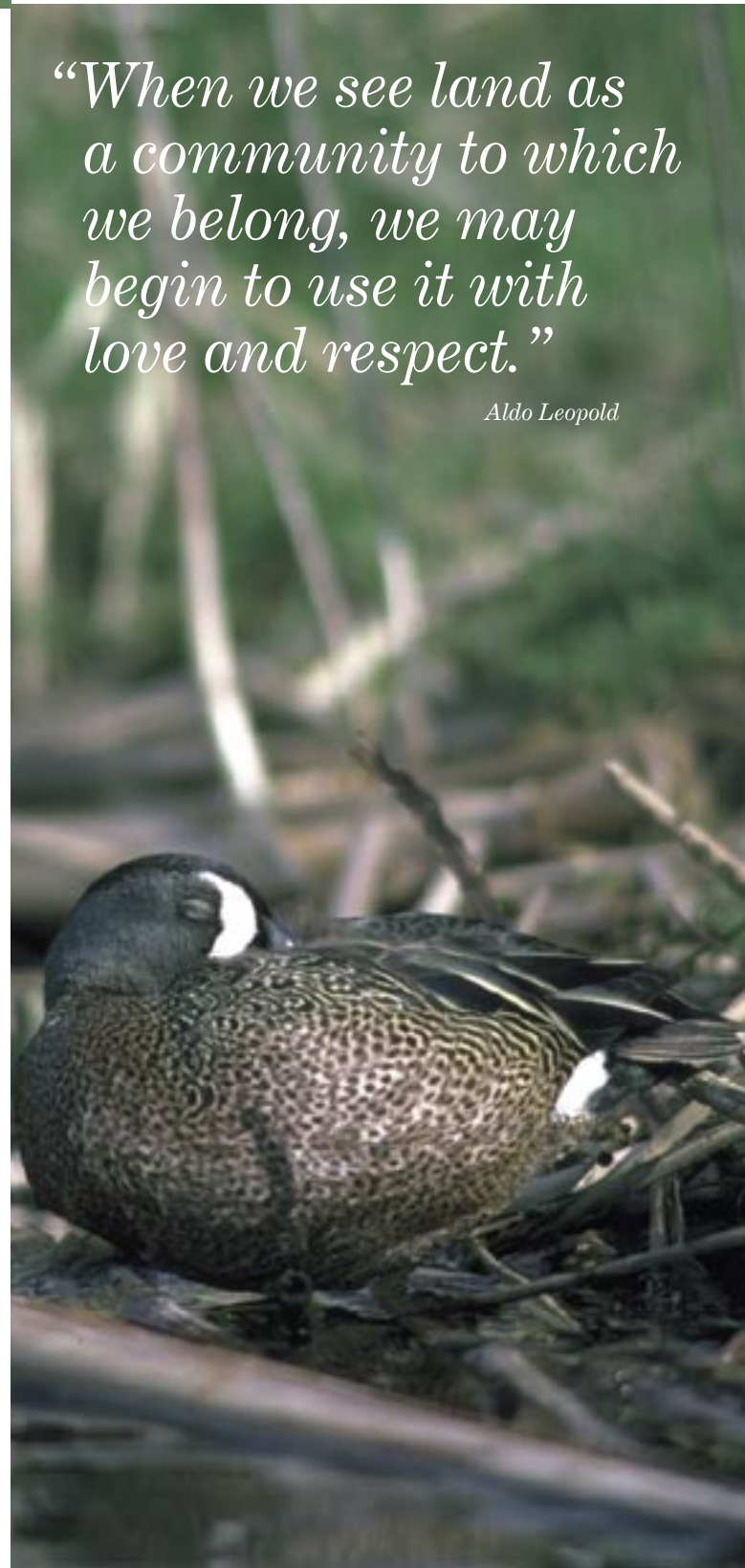

- Firearms are permitted only while engaged in hunting during established open seasons.
- No motorized equipment such as snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles, or boat motors (including electric types).
- No camping or fires.
- No horseback riding.
- No target shooting (including "clay birds").
- No commercial enterprises.
- No placement or hunting over bait.
- Dogs must be on a leash; except while engaged in hunting during established open seasons.
- Nontoxic shot is required for ALL hunting.
- Blinds and tree stands must be removed daily. Damage to trees (i.e. cutting shooting lanes, and use of screw-in tree steps and stands) is prohibited.
- Possession or use of alcoholic beverages while hunting is prohibited.
- Do not litter, destroy or remove any vegetation, natural objects or other public property.
- Public use is prohibited from dusk to dawn, except for hunting in accordance with State laws.
- Shining or spot lighting wildlife is prohibited.

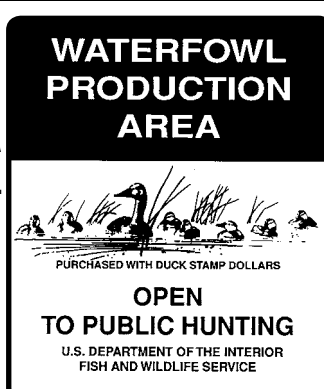
