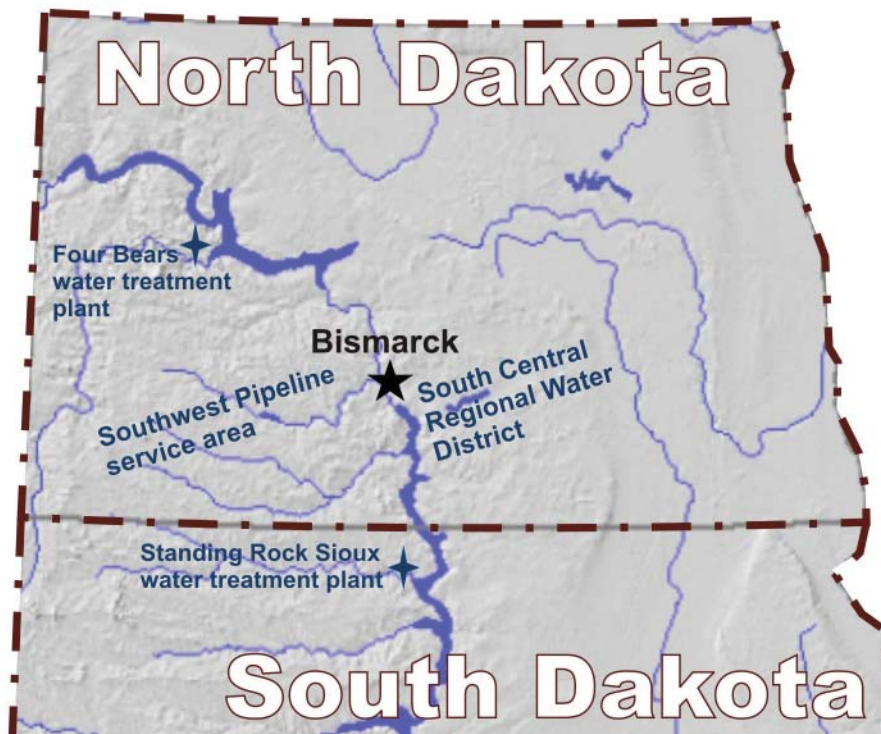


Garrison Rural Water Projects

Project Description

Recovery Act funding will provide needed improvements at a number of drinking water facilities in North Dakota and South Dakota. These activities include: the construction of a new water treatment plant (WTP) and storage at Wakpala, SD for the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe (\$19 million); piloting and design of an existing WTP rehabilitation/expansion project for the Spirit Lake Sioux Tribe to address arsenic compliance issues (\$1.5 million); expansion of the Four Bears WTP for the Three Affiliated Tribe Rural Water System (\$6.5 million); the construction of a new WTP for the Southwest Pipeline Project (\$12 million) and a new intake and WTP for the South Central Regional Water District (\$20 million).



Project Benefits

Completing these activities will:

- Accelerate completion of projects that will result in serving more people with reliable supplies of drinking water.
- Reduce administrative costs by completing projects sooner.
- Provide quality drinking water to people that currently have poor quality water or have to haul water.
