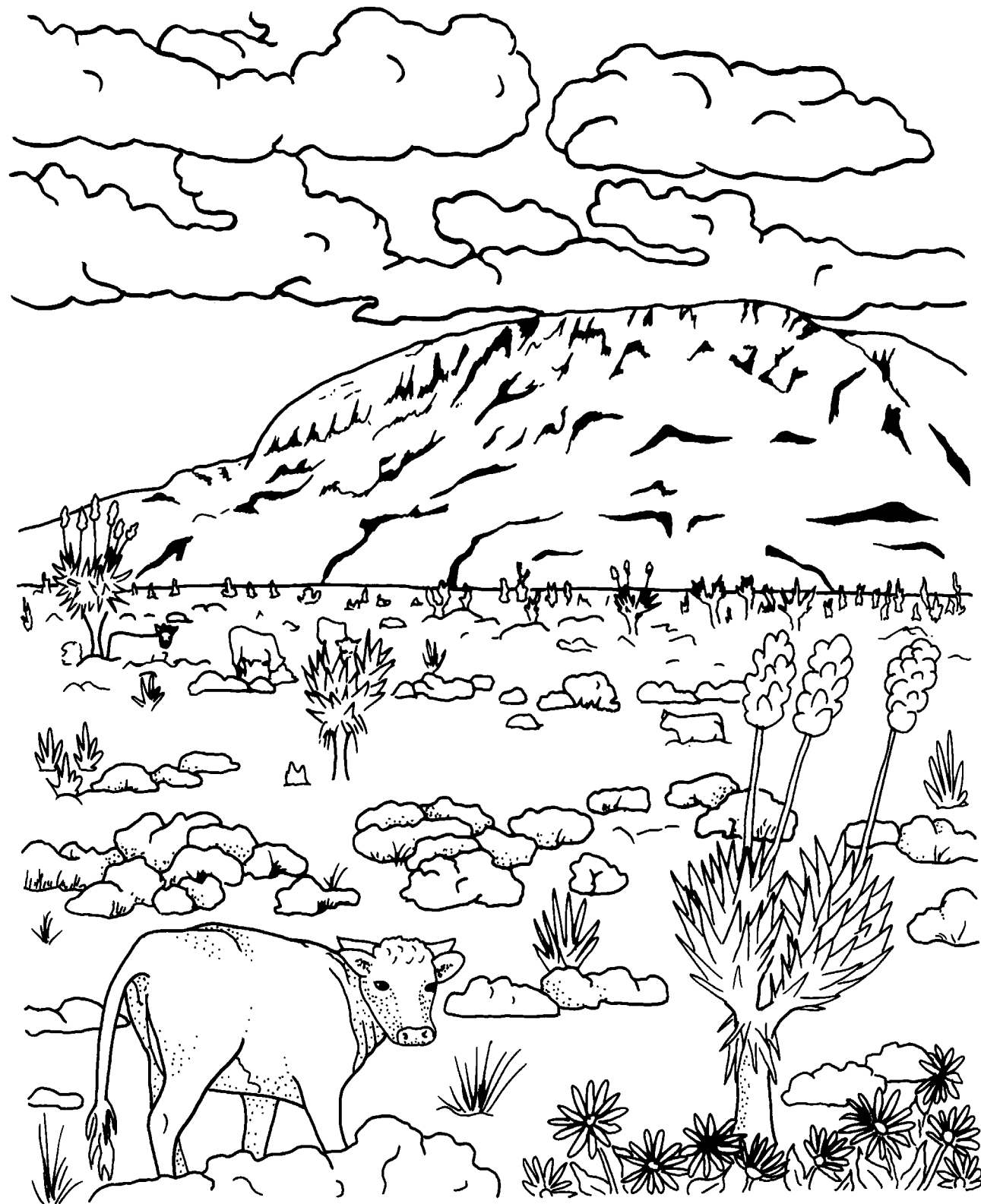

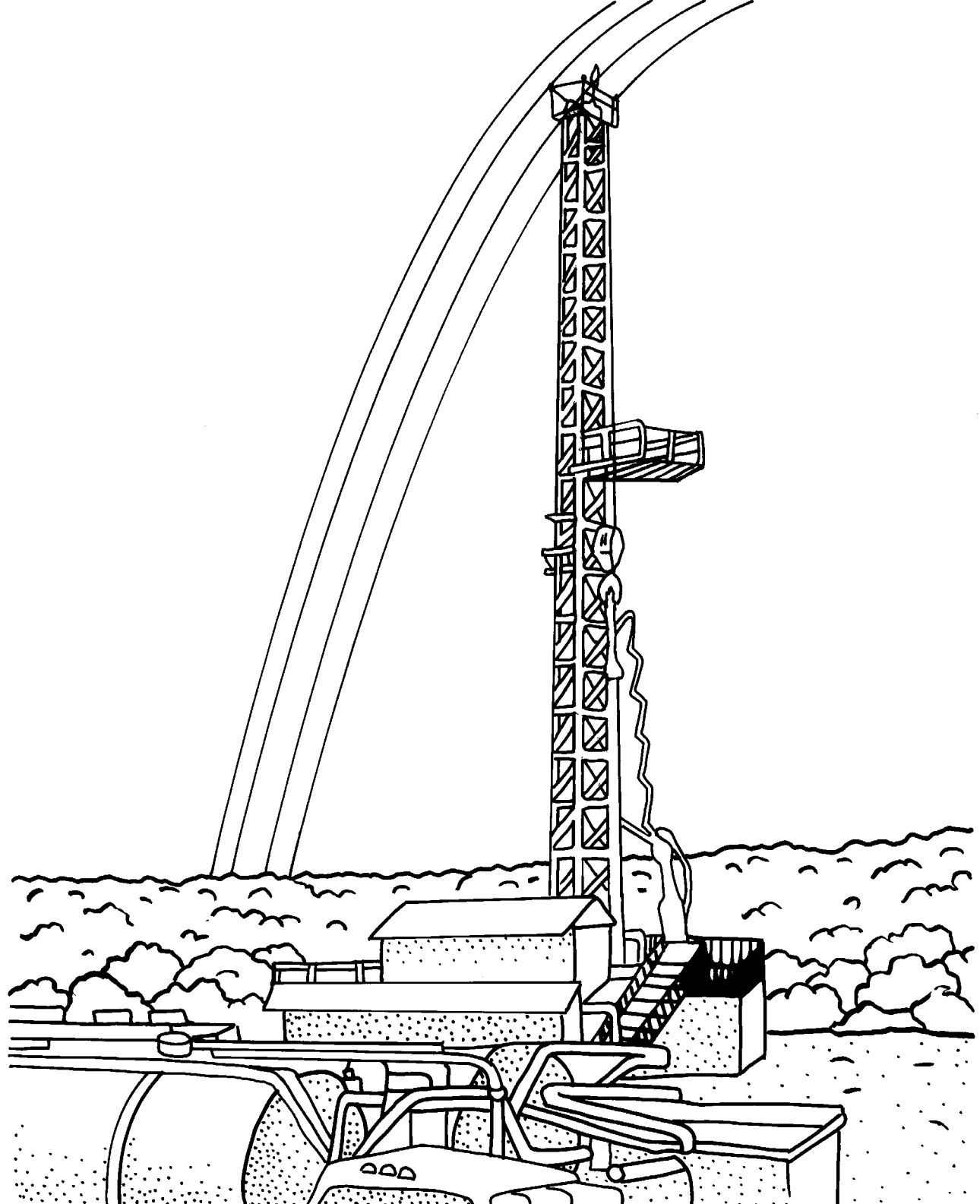
What is the Bureau of Land Management (BLM)?

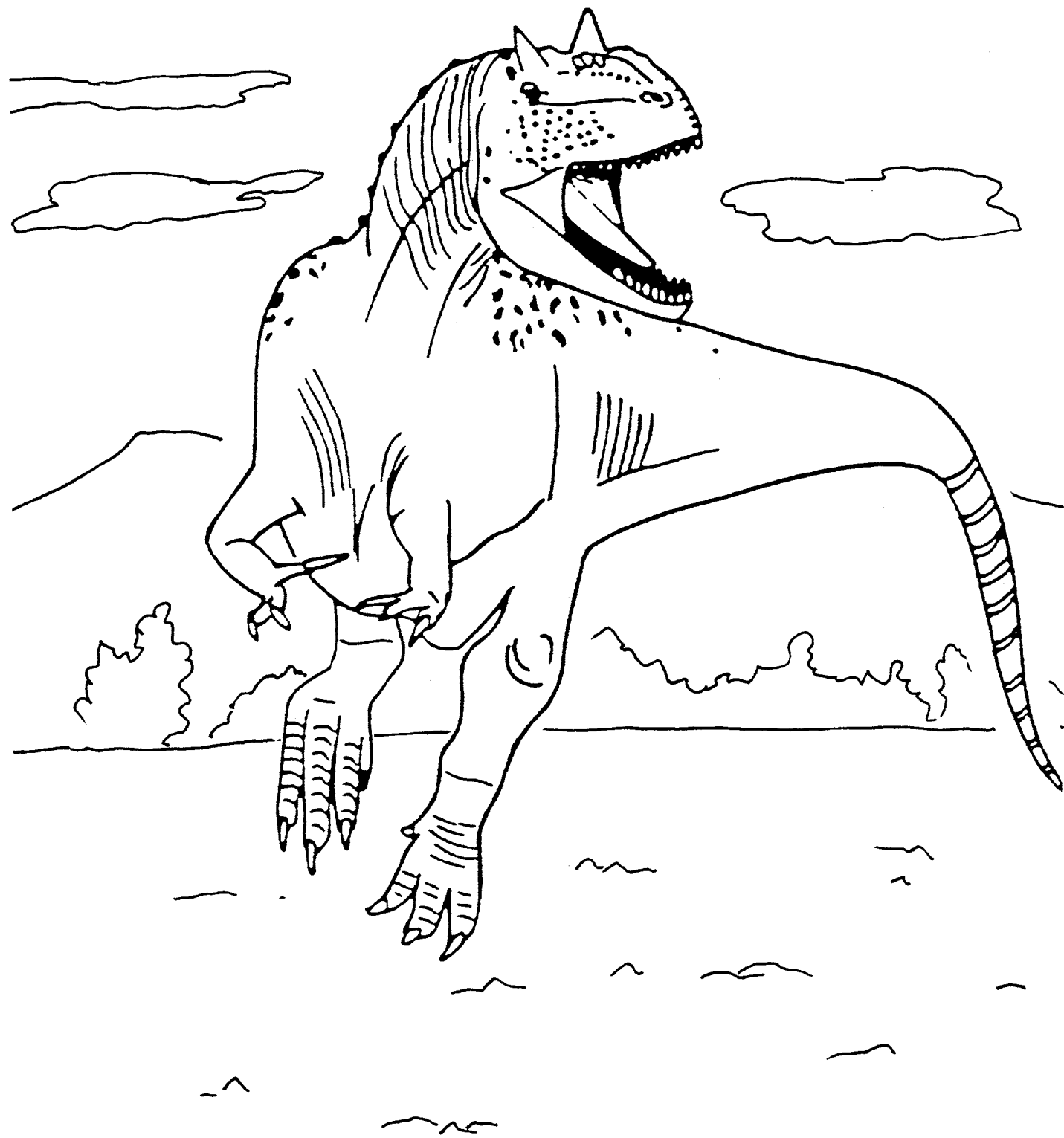
In Colorado, we also have energy programs, livestock grazing, and landscapes that are fun to visit. Come on in – and have fun with your coloring book!



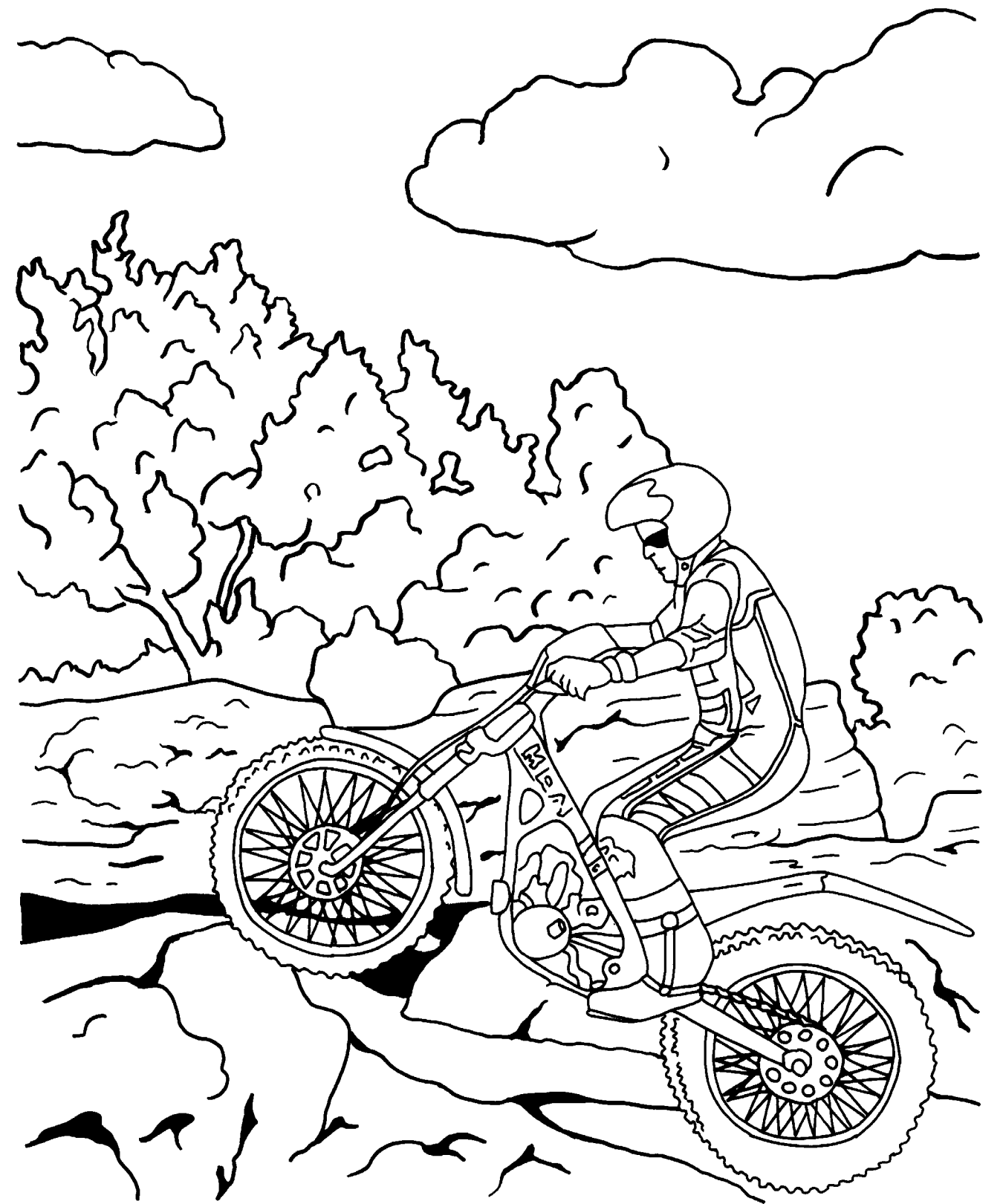

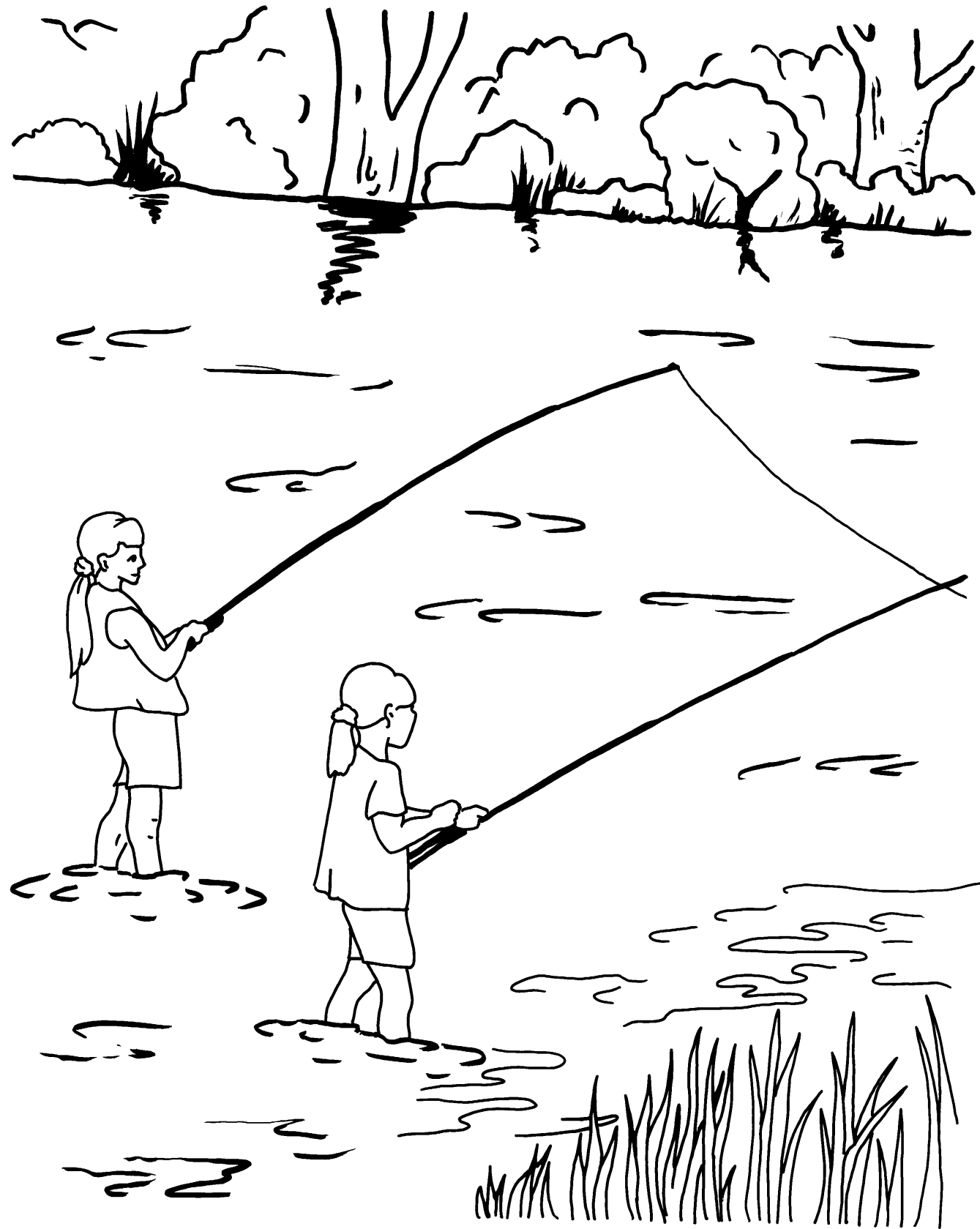
Rainbow over an oil drilling rig



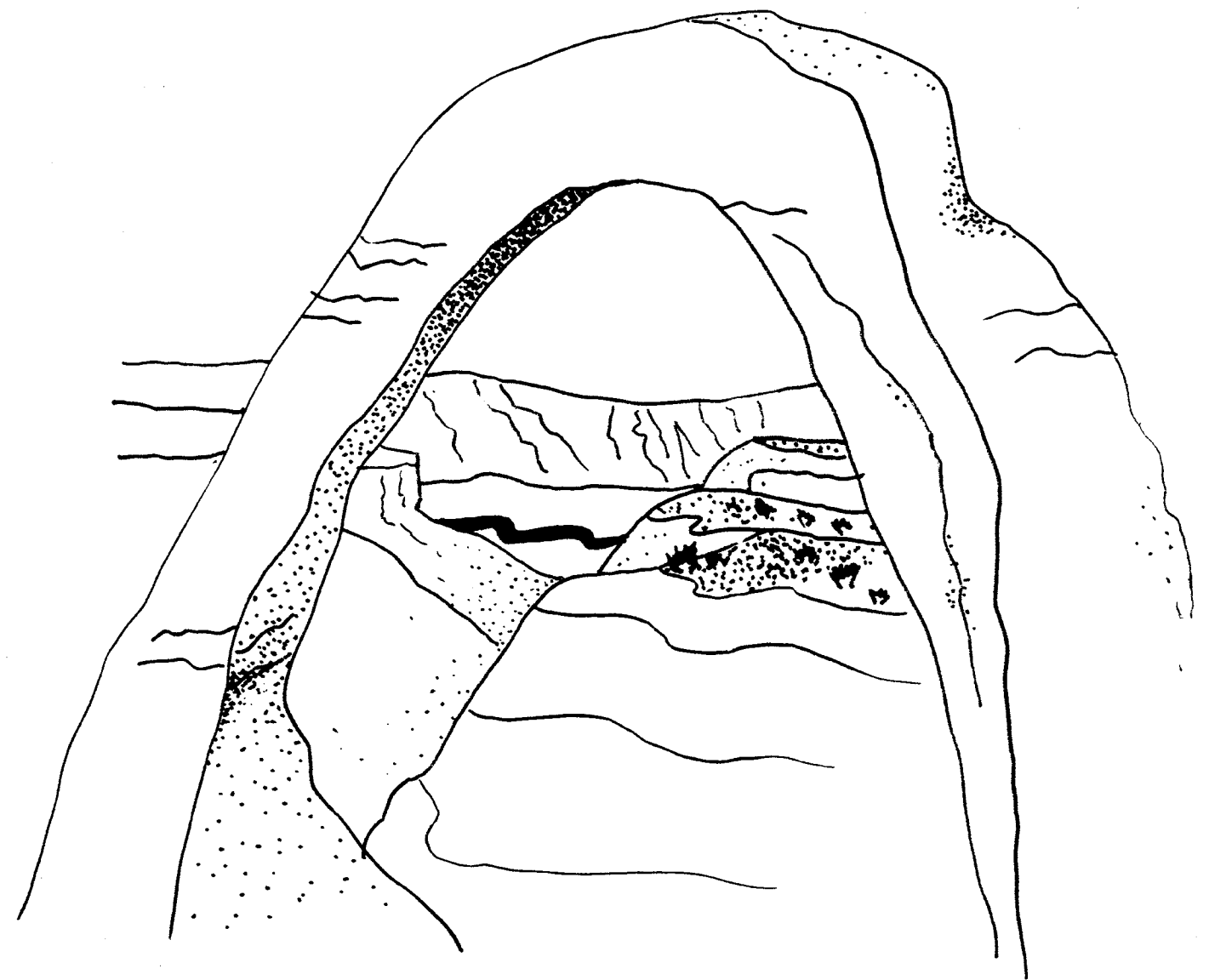
Allosaurus once roamed in Colorado

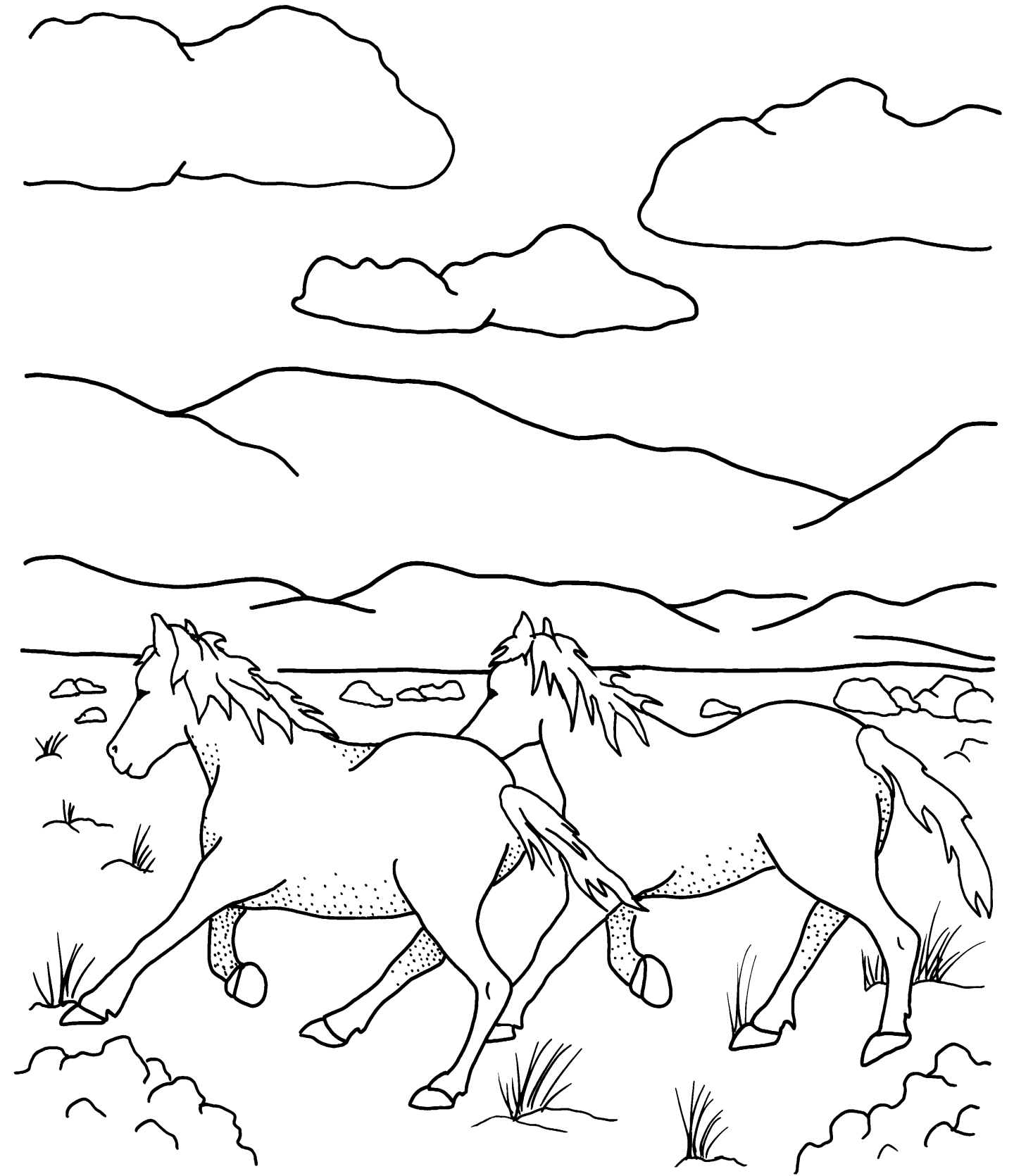

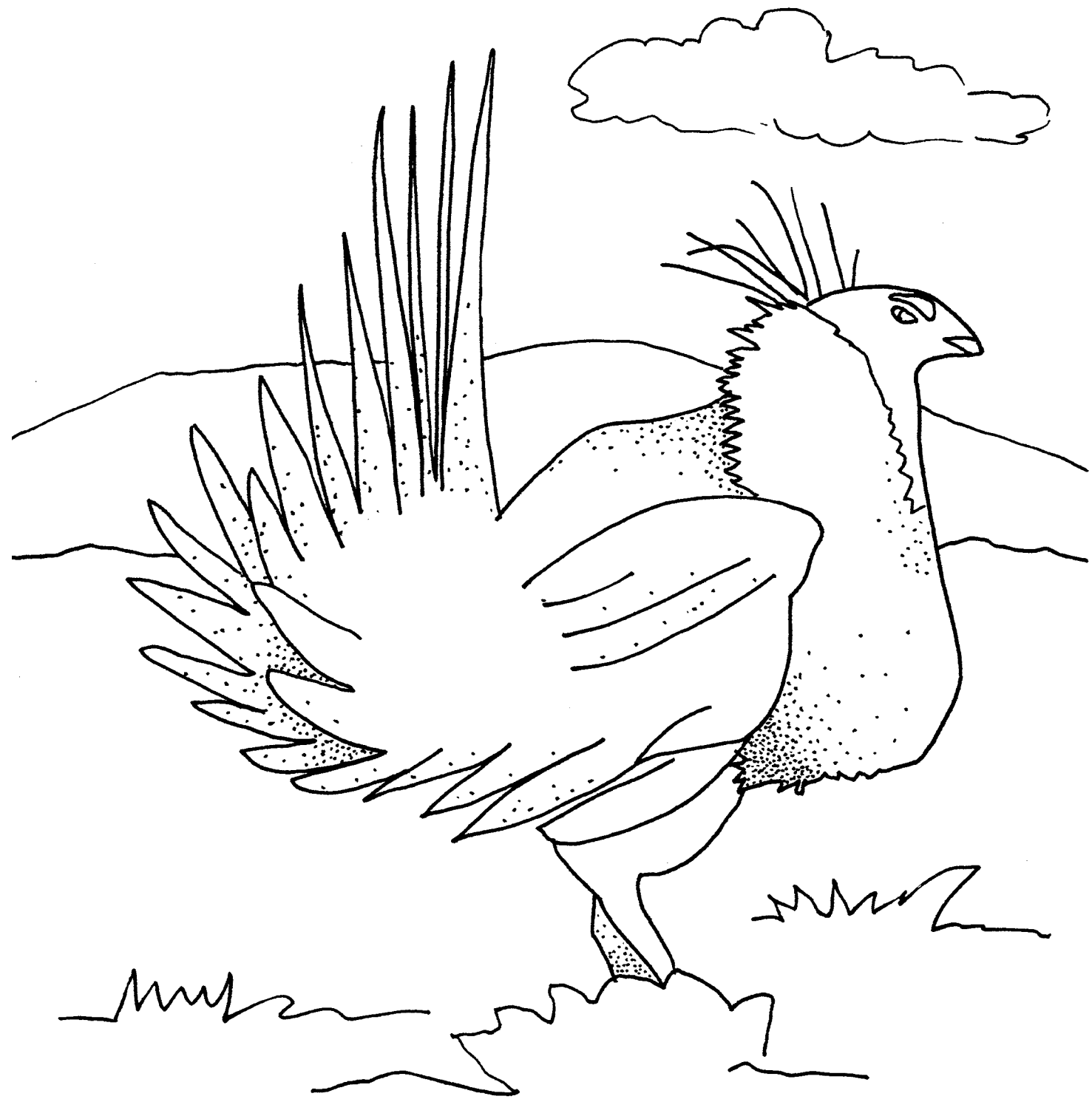
Natural arches can be discovered in McInnis Canyons National Conservation Area

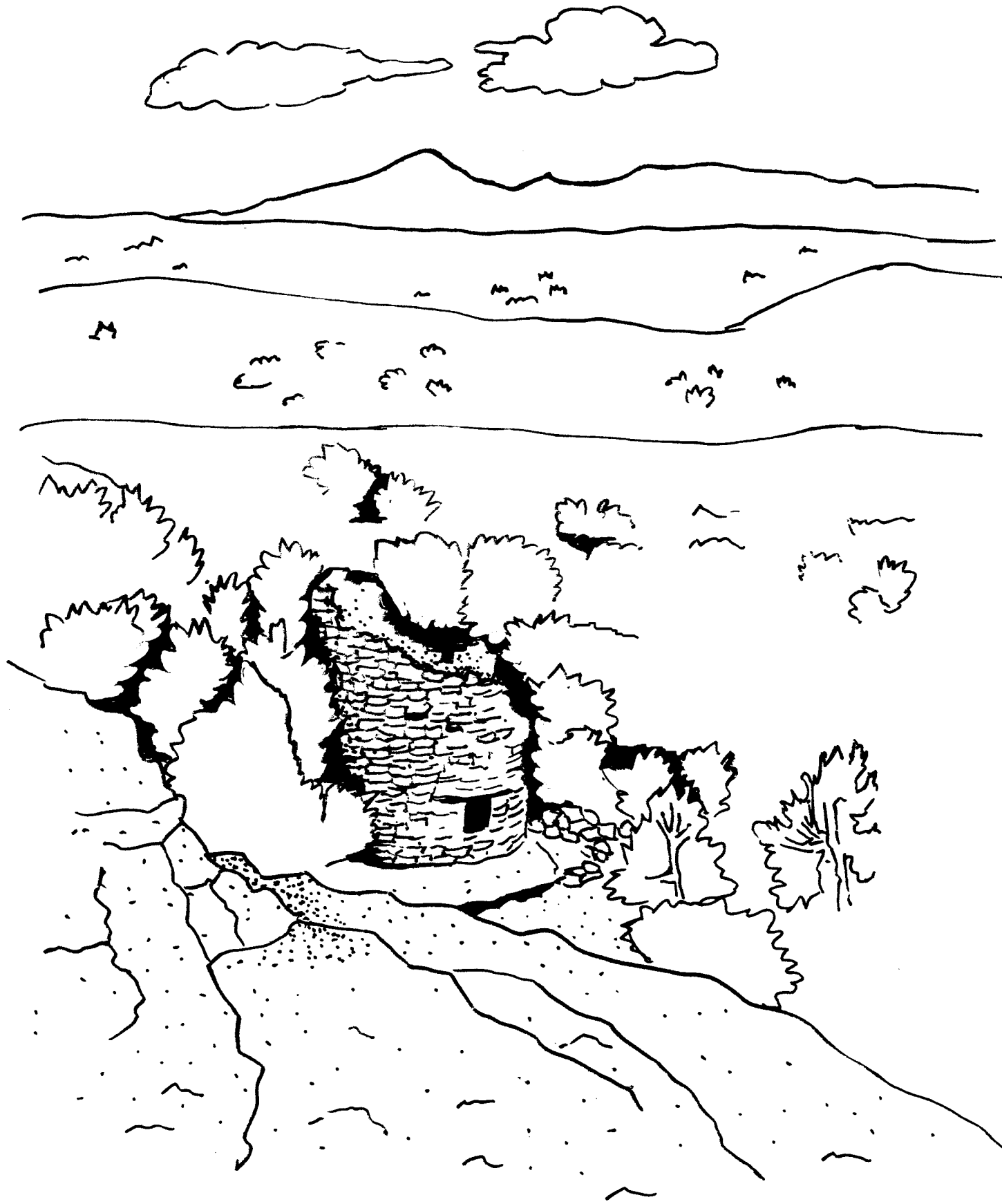
