The agency investigates allegations of judicial misconduct or disability, and takes appropriate action, including discipline, formal proceedings that could result in the judge's removal from office.
The SCIC funding priorities for the	e FY10/11 biennium are as follows:

- Increased funding for commissioner travel;
- Increased funding for part-time attorney to move to full-time status;
- Funding for vacant FTE;
- Increased funding for court reporter services at commission hearings;
- Increased funding for staff attorney salaries;
- Increased funding for general counsel salary;
- Funding for Lump-sum compensation upon employee separation;
- Funding for staff merit raises;
- Funding for improved security measures at commission office entrances

Item 1: Increased funding for Commissioner travel:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of \$31,200 in FY10/11 for Commissioner travel. The SCJC, like every other state agency, is struggling to adjust to rising fuel prices. Recent reports indicate these costs have more than doubled since 2004. The additional funds requested take into account the increased costs to the agency associated

with commissioner travel, including the higher costs of fuel and airfare. These expenses are necessary to ensure that the agency is able to conduct at least 6 meetings per year with 13 Commissioners in attendance. Recent appointments of members to fill vacancies and hold-over positions have resulted in greater attendance at meetings than ever before. Most meetings are three days long, requiring some members who travel greater distances to arrive the night before. Without adequate funding for Commissioner travel, the agency will struggle to provide judges and the public with timely and appropriate resolutions to their complaints and to meet the agency's performance goal for 100% disposition of cases.

Item 2: Increased funding for part-time attorney to move to full-time status:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of \$66,920 in FY10/11 to allow a part-time attorney to move to full-time employment status. The staff attorney in question has been a part-time employee for 3 years and plans to transition to full-time status in FY10. She has been licensed to practice for 26 years, and engaged in the active practice of law for 20 years. She is a tremendous asset to the agency.

Item 3: Funding for vacant FTE:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of \$33,091 in FY11 to fund a vacant FTE. With a key employee on the legal team approaching retirement and with the implementation of an online complaint filing procedure anticipated to increase the number of filings by at least 5%, the SCJC needs to hire a legal assistant to support the legal team in screening cases, performing legal research and writing duties, supporting the Senior Legal Assistant in preparation of cases for trial and for presentation to the commission, assist in clerk of the commission duties, and assist in the closing of cases. Historically, the SCJC has operated with two legal assistants and has the workload to support two such positions, but not the funding. The funding for this position would be consistent with that of an entry-level legal assistant.

Item 4: Increased funding for court reporter services:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of 10,000 in FY10/11 for court reporter services. The SCJC always records its proceedings, and typically relies on the audio recording equipment supplied to the hearing rooms by the State Office of Administrative Hearings, who provide the agency with the space needed to conduct its hearings. The SCJC has found that the more complicated or high-profile cases often require the additional presence of a certified court reporter to ensure an accurate and complete record of the proceedings. Hearings involving multiple cases against a single judge which result in both public and private findings or dismissals require the ability to redact from the public record any reference to matters relating to the private discipline or to the dismissal of an issue. On occasion, a system failure involving the audio recording equipment has been discovered before or during the course of a hearing, which has prevented recordings of the proceedings. Additionally, court reporter transcripts of videotaped witness testimony can more readily be shared with and reviewed by commissioners than the tapes themselves, which require special viewing software, more computer storage space, and updated laptops and/or computers.

Item 5: Increased funding for attorney salaries:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of \$52,000 in FY10/11, representing a 10% increase in current attorney salaries, in order to bring SCJC staff attorney compensation more in line with that of staff attorney positions at the Texas appellate courts and at judicial conduct agencies in other states. Staff attorneys at the appellate courts and other judicial conduct agencies earn approximately \$80,000 per year. SCJC attorney salaries are currently at \$65,000. SCJC attorneys have, on average, nearly 20 years of legal experience.

Item 6: Increased funding for general counsel salary:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of \$12,600 to increase the salary of the General Counsel to align the compensation with that of comparable positions state and nation-wide.

Item 7: Funding for lump-sum compensation upon employee separation:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of \$5,000 in FY10 to allow for a lump-sum payment to separating/retiring employees who have accumulated annual leave benefits. There are several long-term employees who, if separated from employment during the FY10/11 biennium, would be entitled to a lump-sum payment of accrued annual leave. This would place a significant financial burden on the agency's limited budget and strained resources. In anticipation of these events, which may not occur, the SCJC feels it is prudent to plan for the expenditure in its FY10/11 budget.

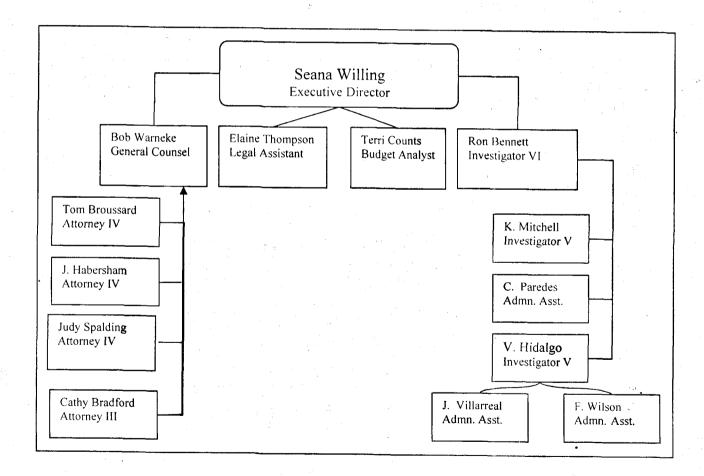
Item 8: Funding for staff merit raises:

The SCJC is requesting an increase of \$13,200 in FY10/11 to allow management to reward and retain employees with merit raises or bonuses for exceptional performance. Over the past 5 years, following a period of unprecedented turnover, the SCJC has benefited by implementing reward programs to its employees, many of whom are now long-term employees as a result. However, the agency has never been sufficiently funded for such a program and feels it is prudent to plan for such expenditures in its FY10/11 budget.

Item 9: Funding for security:

The SCJC is requesting \$6,000 in FY10/11 for improved security measures at the entrances to the commission offices, as well as for ongoing training in security and disaster preparedness. To ensure greater security of its physical offices, for the protection of staff, state property, and confidential records, the SCJC would like to install card-reader access pads to each of its exterior doors, so that only authorized SCJC employees have the ability to access the suite. The current key-pad system is difficult to maintain and easy to override and bypass, placing staff, equipment, and records at risk. The additional funding would also allow SCJC staff to be adequately trained in the event of a security breach or a disaster.

DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

The SCJC is requesting funds in FY10/11 for Commissioner travel. The SCJC, like every other state agency, is struggling to adjust to rising fuel prices. Recent reports indicate these costs have more than doubled since 2004. The additional funds take into account the increased costs to the agency associated with commissioner travel, including the higher costs of fuel and airfare. These expenses are necessary to ensure the agency is able to conduct at least 6 meetings per year with 13 Commissioners in attendance. Recent appointments of members to fill vacancies and hold-over positions have resulted in greater attendance at meetings than ever before. Most meetings are three days long, requiring some members who travel greater distances to arrive the night before.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

Without adequate funding for Commissioner travel, the agency will struggle to provide judges and the public with timely and appropriate resolutions to their complaints and to meet the agency's performance goal of 100% disposition of cases.
