The New, the Amended, & the Repealed

PT Rule Changes , April 2001 - November 2002

The Board has made a number of changes to the rules since the April 2001 issue. All of those changes, summarized below, are included in the new November 2002 issue of the rules. Please throw away (or archive) your salmon-colored April 2001 PT rules. Don't forget – if you lose your rules or they are not handy, you can always download a copy of the latest issue from the Board's website,

www.ecptote.state.tx.us.

Most of the rule amendments in the past year deal with licensure processes, such as initial licensure or renewal requirements. Several reflect revisions to the way the Board conducts business, while two amendments and one new rule directly affect the practice of physical therapy. Also, the Executive Council has adopted changes to renewal fees. All fees are printed at the back of the rules.

Practice-related Changes

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§321.1, Definitions

The Board amended the definition of "asymptomatic".

§322.1, Provision of Services

The Board removed the language which barred PTs from accepting referrals from foreign practitioners. As the rule now reads, a PT may accept referrals from a practitioner who is licensed



in another state OR one who is licensed in another country. In either instance, the PT is responsible for determining (Continued on page 2)

Board Members Pass the Baton to New Appointees

fter many months of Anticipation, new appointments to the PT Board became official in time for the April 2002 guarterly board meeting. The Board operating without one of its public members (Holly Hall, who resigned for personal reasons) from the summer of 2000 until all new members were appointed, while two other board members, Mary Daulong, PT, and Susan Tripplehorn, public member from Pampa, graciously continued to serve on the Board for more than a year past the expiration of their terms in January 2001. Board and staff miss the expertise and contributions of both Ms.

Daulong and Ms. Tripplehorn, but were glad to welcome their replacements.

We should also note that Charles P. Turco, PhD, public member of the OT Board and the first Presiding Officer of the Executive Council, has been replaced on the OT Board and the Executive Council. Although Dr. Turco never served on the PT Board, he played a major role in the Council's development from its inception in September 1993. Dr. Turco also continued to serve on the OT Board and the Executive

§329.5, Licensing Procedures for Foreign-trained Applicants

The Board amended this rule several times during the course of the year. Amendments to this rule

As the rule now reads, a PT may accept referrals from a practitioner who is licensed in another state OR one who is licensed another country.

she can choose not to accept a referral.

§346.3, Early Childhood (ECI) Setting

The Board has added a section dealing specifically with the early childhood setting, primarily to address concerns with developmental rehabilitation services (DRS), a new service developed by the Texas Interagency Council on Early Childhood Intervention (ECI). This new rule clearly states that when a PT provides DRS, or supervises the provision of DRS, those activities are not physical therapy.

Licensure-related Changes

§329.2, License by Examination

The changes to this rule concern reexamination requirements for licensure applicants who have failed the national PT or PTA exam more than twice. The Board expanded the list of those who can tutor a PTA reexamination candidate, and changed the reexamination application process.

§329.1, General Licensure Requirements and Procedures

The Board changed the education requirements to match the CAPTE accreditation standards. These requirements do not affect those who have already received a PT degree from an accredited program.

added exemptions to English language proficiency requirements for certain applicants; changed licensure by endorsement requirements

for foreign-trained applicants; corrected several incorrect references; and clarified that applicants must have received a passing grade on all coursework required for licensure.

Also, The Board changed the education requirements to match the CAPTE accreditation standards. The new education requirement does not affect those who have already received a PT degree from a program equivalent to a CAPTE accredited program.

§341.1, Requirements for Renewal & §341.2, Continuing Education Requirements

The Board added statements to both of these rules to make it clear that licensees who renew more than 90 days late must submit proof of CE with the renewal.

§341.8, Inactive Status

The Board amended this rule several times. As it now stands, licensees going inactive, renewing the inactive status and reactivating a license must do the same amount of approved continuing education as an active licensee, and renewing the inactive status requires a fee. Also, fees have been increased for the inactive status.

§347.1, Definitions (Registration of PT Facilities)

The Board has amended the definition of facility by defining a "portable" facility. The term is used to describe not only a mobile PT unit, but also the practice of physical therapy which takes place in non-exempt, non-registered facilities and meets certain other conditions. This change is primarily to address issues arising from the delivery of "worksite healthcare".

Board Governance Changes

§323.4, Applications Review Committee

This rule was broadened to allow the Committee to address all licensure application issues, not just foreign-trained issues.


§325.1, Elections

Board elections will not be held until new board members are appointed by the Governor to replace members whose terms have expired.

§325.2, Quorum

This rule, which set a quorum at two/thirds of the Board (six members), has been repealed. The Board's quorum will now be the standard simple majority, i.e. five members.

Board's Eye View Non-standard Practice Settings

G enerally, a good rule is one that is broad enough to be useful to most therapists in most situations. This is especially true of rules that address aspects of physical therapy treatment, e.g. referral, evaluation, treatment, documentation and supervision. So when we write a rule about the practice of physical therapy, we try to keep several criteria in our collective mind. For one thing, the rule has to take into account a range of professional competencies, from the new therapist fresh out of school to the one who has been working for 20+ years. It has to be applicable in many different situations, from home health to hospitals. The rule should be appropriate regardless of the patient's age – whether it's six months or sixty years. And in Texas more than in some other states, a rule has to work in big cities AND rural counties.

However, the practice of physical therapy sometimes takes place in a setting that calls for special attention by the Board. Several of these settings, specifically school and early childhood, are addressed in Chapter 346, Practice Settings for Physical Therapy. PTs and PTAs in home health also deal with many of the same issues. These three settings have several things in common: They often involve several professions (PT, OT, Speech, etc.) and patients in these settings frequently require services for an indefinite length of time. Treatment goals may be limited by the setting itself, as happens in the school setting, where goals reflect only what a child needs to function successfully in school. Also, PTs are often asked to provide services other than direct physical therapy, such as consulting with other professionals or supervising people who are not working under a PT Plan of Care.

In these settings, the line between physical therapy treatment and other types of training or treatment can be confusing. Many therapists are least confident about drawing that line when the question involves supervision and/or delegation of some aspect of treatment. (And the problem is often made worse by reimbursement requirements – which should not be confused with rules, though they can sound like rules because they also deal with supervision and delegation.) The 2001 adoption by the Texas Council on Early Childhood Intervention (ECI) of a new type of service, Developmental Rehabilitation Services (DRS), raised many issues for PTs working in the early childhood setting, and provides a good example of supervision/delegation issues that can arise in this setting and others.

A brief intro to developmental rehabilitation services: DRS is medically necessary special instruction, separate from any other treatment. It is provided by a trained Early Intervention Specialist, (teacher, parent, other non-professional) or a medical professional. It can be the only service a child gets through ECI, or it can be provided along with PT, OT, speech, etc. DRS requires that one of the professionals on the child's "team" supervise the provision of those services. DRS does not replace any other medically necessary service, so a PT can find herself playing one or more of several roles: she could be only providing physical therapy, she could be only providing DRS, she could be providing physical therapy and either providing or monitoring DRS. To make it more complex, the PT may provide training and support to the non-professional (aide, teacher, parent)

(1) Carolyn Lewis, PT #1006310 (Wichita Falls) – failed to properly supervise subordinate - allowed the practice of physical therapy by a

person not licensed to practice. Violation of §453.351 of the Act and Chapter 322 of the Board Rules.

Board Order suspended her license for thirty (30) days.

(2) Jeanne Rappsilber, PTA #2033827 (Tyler) – abandoned patients. Violation of §453.351 of the Act and Chapter 322 of the Board Rules. *Board Order suspended her license for thirty (30) days.*

(3) Christie Fryatt, PT #1129450 (San Antonio) – abandoned patients. Violation of §453.351 of the Act and Chapter 322 of the Board Rules. Board Order suspended her license for sixty (60) days; required sixteen (16) hour tutorial; completion of ethics course.

(4) Stephen Ernst, PT #1023380 (Waxahachie) – convicted of felony DWI; used alcohol to an extent that affected his professional competence. Violation of Section 453.351 of the Act. Board Order suspended his license for sixty (60) days; required compliance with 10-year Court probation.

(5) Julie Shalen, PT #1124170 (Dallas) – practiced with an expired license. Violation of §453.351 of the Act and Chapter 322 of the Board Rules. *Board Order required sixty (60) hours of community service.*

(Missouri City) - entered into deferred adjudication agreement with Court. Violation of §453.351 of the Act. Board Order required compliance with Court probation.


W hat guidelines does the Board offer to PTs in any of these settings? Here are a few: If you are providing direct physical therapy services, make it clear in the PT Plan of Care what they are and when you carry them out. Make sure that when you delegate physical therapy activities to a PTA, your documentation reflects those delegated services, and tracks the provision of them. When you are responsible for providing services that are not PT (e.g., DRS), make sure the documentation reflects the difference. Document training you give any non-licensed persons who are working with the patient or child. And if you instruct those people to carry out any exercises, etc., it is your duty to make sure they know how to carry them out effectively and safely.

If you are given general responsibility for the patient's care while a home health aide or family member is working at home with the patient, or are responsible for what ECI calls "quarterly consults" i.e., monitoring a child's developmental progress when he or she is not receiving services from PT, OT or another medical professional, remember that this is considered oversight of the case or care being given, not direct supervision of the aides or family members working with the patient/child. If you are providing case oversight, and the patient or child is not progressing as expected, let the team, committee, or physician – whichever is correct for your setting – know, so that a new evaluation can be done and the correct services provided.

L icensees sometimes ask whether they are "liable" for services they are asked to provide, especially when they fall outside of direct physical therapy. The bottom line is that a PT is responsible, or "liable", for all of his or her actions. You are responsible for your license. If you think that what you are being asked to do is not within your scope of practice, you have the right and responsibility to say no. If you are in doubt, consult the rules, specifically Chapters 322 and 346. If your question is not answered in the rules, please call the Board. The Board expects therapists in all settings to use professional judgment to determine what is best for each patient or child in a particular situation. **b**

Working as a licensed professional in the healthcare field means that you have to deal with many people, regulatory bodies and organizations that have the power to affect the way you work and do business. You may have an employer. supervisor, or administrator maybe all three – or you may be self-employed.
