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# Linda R. Rounds, PhD, Recognized as Inaugural Member of Academy of Master Teachers by University of Texas Medical Branch

Linda Rounds, Ph.D.,RN, FNP, FAANP, President of the Texas Board of Nursing, was recognized as one of eighteen inaugural members to join the Academy of Master Teachers for the University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB) in Galveston. The Academy of Master Teachers recognizes and honors the University's best teachers, promotes educational scholarship, and serves the needs of the community of educators. Dr. Rounds was also promoted to

the rank of Professor in the School of Nursing at UTMB on September 1, 2007, after serving as an assistant professor since 1983. Currently, she coordinates the Gerontological Nurse Practitioner Program at UTMB.

Linda Rounds has represented nursing on behalf of the State of Texas since 1999. She was appointed to the Board on July 28, 1999, by former governor George W. Bush and was selected to preside over the Board a year later. Dr. Rounds was reappointed to the Board in February 2005 by Governor Rick Perry to preside over the new 13-member board selected to oversee both LVNs and RNs after the combining of the Board of Nurse Examiners with the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners. The Board's name changed on September 1, 2007, becoming the Texas Board of Nursing due to passage of the Sunset Bill for the agency, House Bill 2426 (See p. 4). Dr. Rounds's term on the Board expires on January 31, 2011.

# Rhode Island to become 23<sup>rd</sup> State to Implement Compact; Colorado Now a Compact State

Rhode Island recently passed legislation to join the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC). The state will begin the rule writing process to work toward implementation of the NLC in July, 2008. Currently, 22 other states have enacted the legislation allowing for participation in the NLC. Other states in the Compact include: Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado (implemented Compact on October 1, 2007), Delaware, Idaho, Iowa, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Mississippi, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Virginia and Wisconsin.

# DADS to Add Hundreds of Nursing Positions This Fiscal Year

During the last session, the Texas Legislature approved \$48.8 million to increase staffing in several health and human services programs, including those that serve people with developmental disabilities. The Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services (DADS) will use some of that funding to add additional nurses at its 11 state schools and one state center. The new positions will help improve staff-to-resident ratios and reduce the wage gap between DADS nurses and those in the private sector.

Nurses at these facilities have an opportunity to work with people with mild to severe developmental disabilities, many of whom also have physical disabilities. The state schools and center provide 24-hour residential services, comprehensive behavioral treatment, and health care services. The DADS state schools are located in Abilene, Austin, Brenham, Corpus Christi, Denton, Lubbock, Lufkin, Mexia, Richmond, San Angelo and San Antonio; the state center is in El Paso. 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# Advisory Committee Update

The following advisory committees met in response to charges and directives issued by the Texas Board of Nursing.



### **Advanced Practice Nursing Advisory Committee**

The Advanced Practice Nursing Advisory Committee (APNAC) met on August 15, 2007 to discuss proposed amendments to Rule 219, related to Advanced Practice Nursing Education. The committee's recommendations for amendments to Rule 219 were considered by the Board at the October 2007 meeting. Committee members were also

updated on state and national issues affecting advanced practice nurses. The committee will meet again on November 5. 2007 in Austin.

In compli-

ance with Board Rule 211.6, relating to Committees of the Board, APNAC members elected a new chairperson. James Walker, MS, CRNA, was unanimously elected to fulfill the role of committee chair. Mr. Walker is the director of the Graduate Program in Nurse Anesthesia at Baylor College of Medicine and represents nurse anesthesia education on the committee. Linda Rounds, PhD, RN, FNP, will serve as the Board's liaison to the committee.

# **Nursing Practice Advisory Committee**

As a result of the 80th Legislative Session and the passage of SB 993, the Board charged the Nursing Practice Advisory Committee (NPAC) at the July 2007 meeting with the revision of rules 217.19 and 217.20 related to incident-based and safe harbor peer review.

NPAC met three times in September and drafted proposed revisions to these rules.

During the September 12<sup>th</sup> meeting, the committee unanimously elected John Crossley, PhD, RN, CNAA, as the new chairperson of NPAC. Dr. Crossley is the Chief

Nursing Officer at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas, Texas, and represents the Texas Nurses Association. The Board's liaisons to NPAC are Virginia Campbell, RN, BSN, CNOR, and Beverley Nutall, LVN. (See related article on page 14.)

### Eligibility and Disciplinary **Task Force**

The Eligibility and Disciplinary (E & D) Task Force met on October 9, 2007. The E & D Task Force was approved and created by the Board of Nursing in January 2006 to review and advise the Board on rules and policies related to licensure eligibility and discipline. The Task Force includes members from Texas Association of Vocational Nurse Educators (TAVNE). Licensed Vocational Nurses Association of Texas (LVNAT), Texas League of Vocational Nurses (TLVN), Texas Organization of Associate Degree Nursing (TOADN), Texas Organization of Baccalaureate and Graduate Nurse Educators (TOBGNE), Texas Nurses Association (TNA), Texas Organization of Nurse Executives (TONE),

and the Coalition for Nurses in Advanced Practice (CNAP). Richard Gibbs, LVN, serves as the Board member liaison to the Task Force. Since its creation, the Task Force has proposed recommendations to amend several of the Board's rules including: Rule 213.28 - Licensure of Persons with Criminal Convictions; Rule 213.29 - Criteria and Procedure Regarding Intemperate Use and Lack of Fitness in Eligibility and Disciplinary Matters; and Rule 213.33 - Factors Considered for Imposition of Penalties/Sanctions and/or Fines.

Many of these suggestions, influenced through the Sunset Commission's review of the Board's functions, have been implemented by the Board and adopted into current rules.

On July 13, 2007. the Committee elected Poldi Tschirch. PhD, RN, BC, (TNA representative) as chair. Currently, the task force is reviewing the Board's policies and guidelines on disciplinary

sanctions and will be developing an enforcement matrix that would provide nurses with ready access to the Board's enforcement guidelines, thereby allowing them to better understand the potential consequences of violations.



# **Study Conducted on Effectiveness of Nurse Criminal Background Checks**

Crime and nurses – an oxymoron? As nurses are considered to belong to one of the most trusted professions, "nursing" is typically not synonymous with crime. Unfortunately, a small percentage of Texas nurses and candidates for nurse licensure have a criminal history that must be considered by the Board to determine eligibility for initial or renewal of licensure as a nurse. Due to the nature of nursing and the exposure to vulnerable patients, the Board must ensure that all nurses possess professional character as stated in Section 213.27, relating to Good Professional Character in the Texas Board of Nursing's Rules and Regulations. Although the Board of Nursing has requested self-disclosure of criminal history for many years, there was a well-founded belief that many crimes were not being reported.

In 2003, House Bill (HB) 2208 mandated criminal background checks (CBCs) on all applicants for initial licensure. In 2005, HB 1366 added permission for board action on deferred adjudication or probated criminal sentences (due to the concern for the underlying conduct, not just what action was taken by a criminal court). It also added new §301.4535 to the Nursing Practice Act requiring that the Board revoke, suspend, or refuse to license persons with criminal history related to certain serious crimes that the Legislature deemed relevant to the practice of nursing. House Bill 2208 also added, in 2003, §301.3011 regarding CBC authorization for licensure renewal. Since starting to conduct CBCs for initial licensure in 2004, the Board has completed a combined 107,058 CBCs.

In order to implement the above statutes, the Board has mandated CBCs be completed through submission of fingerprints to the agency, which are then processed by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). How much more effective are these criminal history background checks over the historic self-disclosure policy of the Board? To answer this question, an in-depth research project was conducted by the author at the direction of Katherine A. Thomas, Executive Director, to evaluate the Board's experiences with CBCs.

The research project included the time period beginning September 1, 2002 through August 31, 2006, and encompassed a period both before and after the implementation of mandated CBCs on September 1, 2004. The four main objectives to the research project were to determine: 1) The number of nurses with criminal histories who were disciplined by the Board prior to and after the implementation of the mandated criminal histories; 2) the date of the offense, the nature of the crime (theft, assault, DWIs, hot checks, sexual assaults, etc.), the level of the crime (1st, 2nd, 3rd degree felonies and Class A, B, or C misdemeanors); 3) whether or not the nurse self-disclosed his/her criminal history; and 4) how the Board sanctioned the nurse.

The study showed that a total of 1,508 nurses were disciplined by the Board for criminal histories. Three hundred and thirty nurses were sanctioned due to a criminal history *prior to* the mandated CBCs; and 1,182 nurses were sanctioned due to a criminal history *after* the mandated CBCs. The results showed that 852 more nurses, a 258% increase, were sanctioned after the mandated CBCs. Of the 1,508 case files reviewed, with 3,310 crimes identified, it was calculated that 938 or 28% were felonies and 2,372 or 62% were misdemeanors.

In the two-year time period since implementation of CBCs, two hundred and twenty-seven nurses were sanctioned who *failed* to disclose their criminal histories as required on the licensure renewal form, a 638% increase. These statistics substantiate that the CBCs have been effective in identifying nurses with criminal histories.

Research project results include: the number of nurses categorized by RNs, LVNs, applicants and endorsees sanctioned by the Board due to criminal histories; identification of the nature and level of crimes, disclosure and non disclosure of criminal histories; as well as the sanctions the Board issued for these crimes.

The Board has also published a grid of Disciplinary Guidelines for Criminal Conduct www.bon.state.tx.us/disciplinaryaction/discp-guide.html that lists a number of criminal acts and the typical board action if a nurse is convicted, including deferred or probated sentences, for a listed crime. The Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies www.bon.state.tx.us/disciplinaryaction/dsp.html offer additional insight into how certain crimes relate to the practice of nursing.

# Legislative Update - 80th Regular Texas Legislative Session

The 80th Regular Session of the Texas Legislature concluded May 28, 2007, with passage of a number of bills relating to the practice of nursing in Texas. The following is a brief summary of some of the bills impacting the practice of nursing in Texas.

#### **Bills Amending Nursing Practice Act (NPA)**

Sunset Bill - Texas Board of Nurse Examiners House Bill 2426/Truitt Effective September 1, 2007



House Bill (HB) 2426, the Sunset Bill for the Board of Nurse Examiners, made many changes to the Nursing Practice Act (NPA). Effective September 1, 2007, the name of the agency was changed to the Texas Board of Nursing (BON). Passage of HB 2426 required: establishment of guidelines concerning the consequences of criminal conviction or deferred adjudication; accreditation of nursing and education programs through one or more national nursing accrediting agencies recognized by the United States Department of Education; clarification of the purpose, role, responsibility, and goal of agency advisory committees; establishment of rules which encourage the use of negotiated rule making procedures and alternative dispute resolution; evaluation of nurse examination requirements, administration, and procedures; clarification of requirements of a person who must report a nurse who is impaired or suspected of being impaired; and rules addressing the role of the nursing peer assistance program.

HB 2426 requires that the Texas Board of Nursing accept the requirements for accrediting the governing institution of a school of nursing of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB). It requires the collaboration of the Texas Board of Nursing, the Workforce Commission, and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board in implementing a plan for the creation of innovative nursing education models that promote increased enrollment in the state's nursing programs. Employees of the Board are allowed to dismiss a complaint under certain criteria. The bill establishes a jurisprudence examination to be implemented in 2008. The bill enacts the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Multi-state Compact to be implemented no later than December 31, 2011.

House Bill 8/Riddle

Senate Bill 993 addressed nursing peer review. Changes included: adding the definition of Chief Nursing Officer (CNO) and Patient Safety Committee to the NPA; amending the NPA as it relates to continuing education (CE), deleting requirements relating to Type II CE; amending and clarifying rules relating to reporting of violations and patient care concerns; changing requirements to allow a nurse or other agency to report to a peer review committee (PRC) instead of the BON; clarifying reporting duty of employers as related to a nurse's actions that constitute reportable conduct where, if a PRC determines that system factors impacted a nursing error, that information be provided to patient safety committees or the CNO; clarified language that administrative decisions are not subject to peer review; adding requirements that the BON report systems issues to patient safety committee at a facility or to the CNO if they believe a nurse's deficiency in care was the result of a factor beyond the nurse's control; and requiring that a facility that utilizes 10 or more "nurses" must have policies and be able to convene a peer review committee.

House Bill 8 added "continuous sexual abuse of a child or children under Section 210.02 Penal Code" to the list of 17 crimes located in Section 301.4535 of the NPA. Crimes listed in this section of the NPA mandate that the Board must suspend, revoke, or refuse to license a person who is convicted, or pleads guilty to any of the listed crimes.

House Bill 3167 addressed minor numbering errors in the NPA which occurred in the 79th Texas Legislative Session.

#### Other Bills Involving Nursing Practice

#### **Automated External Defibrillators**

#### House Bill 92 Author: Branch Effective: 5/8/07

Nurses and entities that purchase automated external defibrillators (AEDs) should be aware that AEDs require a prescription by a licensed practitioner in the course of their practice.

#### Senate Bill 7 Author: Hinojosa Effective: 9/1/07

School nurses and other key school personnel must participate in a CPR/AED certification program with the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross. School nurses will be an integral part of the purchasing, training, maintenance, and monitoring of a Public Access to Defibrillation (PAD) program.

#### **APNs**

#### Senate Bill 24 Author: Nelson Effective: 9/1/07

Provides for Medicaid reimbursement of physicians providing telemedicine services

(assessment and evaluation) from a distance site if another provider is on site and the patient's condition is not likely to deteriorate significantly within 30 days of the date the service is provided.

#### Birthing

#### House Bill 709 Author: Puente Effective: 5/17/07

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) to develop brochure on uses/risks/ benefits/future use/storage of stem cells found in umbilical cord blood. Brochure must be available on Department of State Health Services (DSHS) web site. Health professionals who attend patients during gestation or delivery are required to provide the brochure to patients and permit patients to arrange for storage or donation of cord blood unless there is a threat to the health of mother/infant or it is against provider's religious beliefs. Pamphlet development and distribution to begin 1/1/2008.

#### **Diabetes**

#### House Bill 3618 Author: Raymond **Effective: 6/15/07**

Relates to the development of a pilot program in border region school districts designed to prevent and detect Type 2 Diabetes.

#### House Bill 3735 Author: McReynolds **Effective: 6/15/07**

Provides local diabetes care and education in the Memorial Health System of East Texas.

#### **Drug Labeling**

#### House Bill 948 Author: Davis Effective: 9/1/07

Requires prescription labels to be: in plain, easy-to-understand language; relevant to the prescription; and in a font size large enough for a patient to easily read.

#### **Education**

#### House Bill 3443 Author: Howard Effective: 6/15/07

Establishes a Hospital-Based Nursing Education Partnership Grant Program to increase the number of nurses in Texas by fostering innovation through partnership models.

#### Senate Bill 138 Author: Nelson Effective: 9/1/07

Requires the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) to develop methods to promote retention and graduation of students enrolled in a professional nursing program and adopt rules to implement those methods the board considers feasible, including recommendations on financial aid.

#### Senate Bill 139 Author: Nelson **Effective: 6/15/07**

The THECB, in consultation with the Board of Nursing, shall conduct a study to identify methods to improve the curricula of professional and vocational nursing programs. The study must focus on methods to improve instruction on providing safe and high-quality nursing care to patients.

#### Senate Bill 140 Author: Nelson Effective: 9/1/07

Requires THECB and DSHS to conduct a joint study regarding the feasibility of providing free or discounted immunizations to economically disadvantaged students enrolled in health professional degree programs at institutions of higher education in Texas.

#### Senate Bill 141 Author: Nelson Effective: 6/15/07

The Board of Nursing, in consultation with each state agency that is a member of or otherwise represented on the Health Professions Council (HPC), shall conduct a study to evaluate the feasibility of institutions of higher education providing courses in which students enrolled in different health science or health profession education programs may enroll to study basic health science curricula together.

# Senate Bill 201 Author: Nelson Effective: 9/1/07

Requires the THECB to study the tuition exemptions at public institutions of higher education for certain professional nursing program preceptors and their children.

#### Senate Bill 289 Author: Nelson **Effective: 6/15/07**

Encourages nursing schools to utilize more parttime or adjunct faculty by allowing professional nursing shortage reduction grants to be used for part-time faculty.

#### Senate Bill 992 Author: Nelson Effective: 6/15/07

Continues the current dedication of a portion of the tobacco lawsuit settlement funds to support nursing schools.

#### Senate Bill 1185 Author: Nelson Effective: 9/1/07

Creates eligible home loans for professional educators and nursing faculty.

#### **Licensing Information**

# Senate Bill 29 Author: Nelson Effective: 3/1/08

Statewide Health Coordinating Council (SHCC) data collection expanded for health occupations including nurses. Major additions include place of birth, practice setting(s) mailing address (including zip code and county), and weekly hours worked at each practice setting.

#### **Public Health**

#### House Bill 246 Author: Alonzo Effective: 9/1/07

Nurses may be involved in the data collection/ reporting of AIDS/HIV in their practice setting, i.e., doctors offices, public health clinics, infection control, and disease surveillance.

#### House Bill 1082 Author: Straus **Effective: 6/15/07**

Require all labs to report all cases of MRSA to HHSC to track prevalence; develop methodology for electronic information exchange; collect and analyze data regarding the sources and possible prevention of MRSA and report data to HHSC no later than September 1, 2009.

#### House Bill 1370 Author: Coleman Effective: 9/1/07

Creates the Interagency Coordinating Council for HIV and Hepatitis. The Council will coordinate communications on provision of services and develop a plan that facilitates coordination of agency programs concerning prevention and the delivery of services to individuals with HIV/AIDS/Hepatitis

# House Bill 1373 Author: Guillen Effective: 6/15/07

Creates a Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force for early diagnosis and treatment to prolong lives and decrease costs by delaying dialysis and transplantation.

#### House Bill 1379 Author: Deshotel Effective: 9/1/07

Requires DSHS to produce and distribute educational materials on the HPV vaccine.

#### House Bill 2117 Author: Parker Effective: 6/15/07

Clarifies that a person who, in good faith, administers emergency care is not liable in civil damages for an act performed during an emergency unless the act is wilfully or wantonly negligent. This includes persons who administer emergency care using an AED and persons who administer emergency care as a volunteer first responder.

#### House Bill 3473 Author: Delisi Effective: 9/1/07

Amends the laws relating to persons who can consent for treatment of a patient who is incompetent to consent for themselves; adds Home and Community Support Service Agencies (HCSSA) to the list of settings where a third party providing healthcare to the patient would document notification of the family or MPOA by the MD of the condition and treatment for the patient in the medical record.

# Senate Bill 156 Author: Shapiro Effective: 9/1/07

Establishes competitive grant program to fund nurse-family partnership programs or the expansion of existing programs in certain Texas communities. Specifically includes the YWCA of Metropolitan Dallas as a recipient of a grant.

#### Senate Bill 288 Author: Nelson Effective: 6/15/07

Establishes a permanent Advisory Panel on healthcare-associated infections within the regulatory licensing unit of the health care quality section of DSHS as an advisory panel to guide the implementation, development, and evaluation of state healthcare-associated infection rate reporting system.

#### Senate Bill 811 Author: Janek Effective: 6/15/07

DSHS will allow health care providers to select influenza vaccine from the entire list of available influenza vaccine approved by the US FDA, as recommended by the Federal Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.

#### **School Nurses**

#### House Bill 1059 Author: Parker **Effective: 5/15/07**

Requires school districts that maintain an internet web site to post: a list of immunizations required for admission to public school as set forth by the Department of State Health Services and the Public School Board of Trustees; health clinics in the school district that offer influenza vaccine; and a list of recommended vaccines.

#### House Bill 1098 Author: Bonnen Effective: 5/8/07

Prohibits, as a condition for admission to public school, the immunization against Human Papilloma Virus (HPV). Preempts all contrary executive orders of the governor.

# Practice Question and Answer



### Obtaining Specimens for Alcohol or Other Substances Against a Patient's Wishes

- Q: I work in the Emergency Department (ED) and we are frequently asked by law enforcement officers to draw blood from persons who are intoxicated or who may be under the influence of drugs or other substances. Sometimes the person is under arrest, but at other times, the person may not be under arrest. When a person refuses to have his/her blood drawn, must the nurse comply with the request from the law enforcement officer? Does it make a difference if the person is in custody at the time of the request? What is the nurse's liability if drawing blood is against a patient's will?
- A: The Board of Nursing does not regulate practice settings; however, the laws that regulate when blood or other samples may or may not be obtained against a person's wishes are located in chapter 724 of the Texas Transportation Code. The Texas Transportation Code and other State statutes are accessible in their entirety at <a href="http://tlo2.tlc.state.tx.us/statutes/statutes.html">http://tlo2.tlc.state.tx.us/statutes/statutes.html</a>. This web site is maintained by the Texas Legislative Council.

Board staff cannot speak as experts on laws outside of the BON's jurisdiction, but the following summary is offered as staff's understanding of the above laws:

- (1) Transportation Code §724.012(b) states that a peace officer "shall require" the taking of specimens of a person's breath or blood when all of the following conditions exist:
  - (A) The person is under arrest;
  - (B) an accident has occurred in which the person was operating a motor vehicle or water craft (offenses under Ch. 49 Penal Code);
  - (C) the officer has reason to believe that the accident has caused the death or serious bodily injury (as defined in §1.07 Penal Code) of another person; and
  - (D) if the person refuses the officer's request to submit to the taking of a specimen voluntarily.

A nurse is required to obtain a specimen, even against a person's wishes, if the above conditions exist. According to the statute, the peace officer is to designate the type of specimen to be obtained.

- (2) Section 724.013 of the Transportation Code states that <u>except</u> for the conditions listed under §724.012(b), a specimen <u>may</u> <u>not</u> be collected if a person refuses to submit to the taking of a specimen designated by a peace officer. So if there has been no accident and no person (other than the person who was operating a motor vehicle or water craft) has been killed or sustained serious bodily injury, then the person may refuse the taking of a specimen. Additional sections of chapter 724 discuss requirements for a peace officer to notify a person of the consequences of their refusal to submit to the taking of a specimen.
- (3) If a person is alive but is incapable of refusal, a specimen may be collected by "a... registered professional nurse, or licensed vocational nurse." [§ 724.017] (other practitioners are also listed in this statute)
- (4) Section 724.017 of the Transportation Code further provides immunity to the person who takes a blood specimen as well as the facility where the specimen is obtained at the request or order of a peace officer. This immunity does not apply to a person's liability for any negligence in obtaining a blood specimen.

Staff suggest that you also assure that the ED physician is involved with any person to whom ED services are rendered, either with or without the person's consent, as other laws may affect a person's right to refuse medical treatment. Facility policy and procedure should address appropriate nursing actions to assure the nurse's ability to comply with laws that impact the nurse's practice in a given setting.

### **DAVID D. LEAVITT**

David D. Leavitt secured employment as a Manager for Prestige Imaging, LLC, Sherman, Texas, in September, 2005. During his employment with the facility, Mr. Leavitt represented himself as an RN to patients, staff and physicians. He performed contrast injections for CT & MRI procedures and he signed correspondence with an RN, BSN, typed in after his name. On January 10, 2006, the management staff could not verify his licensure. They contacted the Board office and confirmed that Mr. Leavitt was not licensed, at which time he was not allowed to perform duties that required licensed staff. On January 18, 2006, Mr. Leavitt was suspended pending verification of his license. The case was referred to the Dallas County District Attorney's Office.

# **RN Surveyers Needed in Long-Term Care**

To fulfill its mission of ensuring the health and safety of Texans who live in long-term care facilities or who are cared for by home health or hospice agencies, the Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services (DADS) Regulatory Services Division relies heavily on the skills and expertise of nursing professionals. Nurses in DADS' Regulatory Services Division fulfill a variety of roles, including serving as surveyors, compliance reviewers, liaisons between the department and the provider community, program managers, regional directors, and more. As of August 2007, the DADS' Regulatory Services Division had over 40 nurse vacancies across the state.

Nurse surveyors are among the greatest need at DADS' Regulatory Services. Through survey and licensure inspections and complaint and incident investigations, nurse surveyors ensure that regulated facilities and agencies comply with the federal and state rules appropriate to the services they provide. Survey staff determine if providers are meeting the minimum standards and requirements for service, detect conditions that may jeopardize client health and/or safety, and identify deficient practice areas. When such deficiencies are identified and cited, survey staff monitor the provider's plan of correction to ensure that areas of inadequate care are corrected and comply with state and federal requirements.

Careers with DADS' Regulatory Services Division allow registered nurses to use their professional skills in a unique way by playing a vital role in protecting the well-being of our most vulnerable citizens. Nurse surveyor, Jerry Jackson, describes the gratification of working for the DADS' Regulatory Services Division this way, "We get to follow the care of many different residents, so there's a lot of satisfaction there. And when people say they're happy with the care they're receiving, DADS has a role in that, and I take a lot of satisfaction in that."

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# **New Peer Review Rules Drafted to Implement Legislative Changes**

Senate Bill 993 (SB 993) and House Bill 2426 (HB 2426) passed during this year's 80th Texas Legislative session and amended parts of the Nursing Practice Act [Texas Occupations Code (TOC) chapter 301] and the Nursing Peer Review statutes (TOC chapter 303). In September, the Board's Nursing Practice Advisory Committee (NPAC) carried out the Board's charge to review the current peer review rules. The NPAC *recommended* changes to implement the requirements of the statutes that went into effect September 1, 2007 and were proposed as draft rules during the October 18-19, 2007, quarterly Board Meeting. The Board subsequently moved to publish these draft new rules in the *Texas Register* for comment.

Staff anticipate the proposed new peer review rules 217.19 and 217.20 (and repeal of the current rules) will be published in the *Texas Register* on November 2, 2007 with the 30-day period for submission of comments to the board running through December 3, 2007. The *Texas Register* may be accessed online at <a href="http://www.sos.state.tx.us/texreg/index.shtml">http://www.sos.state.tx.us/texreg/index.shtml</a>. The draft rules may also be accessed from the board's web site at <a href="http://www.bon.state.tx.us">http://www.bon.state.tx.us</a>. Click on the "Nursing Laws and Rules" link, and then on the "Proposed Rules" link.

Key points in the proposed new rules include:

- (1) A peer review plan is required for any person or entity who regularly employs, hires, or contracts for the services of ten (10) or more nurses. For safe harbor peer review of a RN, at least five (5) of the nurses must be RNs.
- (2) A nurse whose practice is suspected or known to be impaired by chemical dependency or diminished mental capacity <u>must</u> be reported to the Board (BON) if a person (including the peer review committee) determines or believes that the nurse has also committed a practice violation(s). [TOC §301.410(b); proposed §217.19(g)(2)]
- (3) If an employer is already required to report a nurse to the Board under NPA §301.405(b) because of practice errors that resulted in termination or other substantive disciplinary action, an incident-based nursing peer review committee must still meet to determine if external factors (factors beyond the nurse's control) contributed to the nursing error. The committee is required to report positive findings to the entity's patient safety committee or to the Chief Nursing Officer (CNO) if there is no patient safety committee. [TOC §301.405(c); proposed §217.19(i)(5)]
- Communications between the two committees are confidential and privileged. [TOC §303.0075; proposed §217.19(h)(2)]
- Minimum due process for the nurse does not apply when the nurse has already been reported to the Board, and the incident-based peer review committee is only reviewing the situation to determine the influence of external factors. [proposed rule 217.19(f)(1)]
- (4) The option to utilize an informal work group of the peer review committee to investigate and try to resolve either incident-based or safe harbor peer review issues is proposed

- in §217.19(e) and §217.20(j). This ties in with rule 217.16(g)(2) regarding Minor Incidents.
- (5) "Whistleblower" protections are added at the end of both rule 217.19 and 217.20 prohibiting retaliatory action against a nurse who reports a licensed health care practitioner, agency, or facility that the nurse has reasonable cause to believe has exposed a patient to substantial risk of harm. [TOC §301.4025; proposed §217.19(m) and §217.20(k)]
- (6) A nurse who invokes safe harbor can document a brief "initial" request for safe harbor at the time asked to engage in the conduct, with provision to complete the more detailed request later in the same work period but prior to leaving the work area [proposed §217.20(d)(3)]. This is based on the premise that safe harbor allows the nurse to accept the assignment in the vast majority of cases, since patients are likely to be safer with the nurse than without him/her.
- (7) Any person with administrative responsibility for a nurse who is the subject for either incident-based or safe harbor peer review is prohibited from attending (except as a fact witness) and being a member of the peer review committee. [proposed §217.19(d)(3)(B) and §217.20(h)(4)]
- (8) Proposed rule §217.20(g) adds language to further explain TOC §301.352 that permits a nurse to refuse an assignment. Unprofessional Conduct rule 217.12(1)(E) makes it a violation for a nurse to accept an assignment that "could reasonably be expected to result in unsafe or ineffective client care." Since appropriately invoking safe harbor protects a nurse who accepts an assignment that the nurse believes is unsafe (such as short-staffing on the nurse's home unit), the situation for refusing to accept the initially offered assignment would only be in good faith when the nurse knows he/she lacks the minimum basic competencies to provide safe care.

An example could be a nurse who has only worked with adult medical-surgical patients being floated to the neonatal ICU and assigned full responsibility to care for a critically ill infant. Because the nurse would lack knowledge of normal versus abnormal conditions, equipment, medications/dosages, and routines, in this case the nurse would be justified in seeking a different assignment versus accepting the offered assignment knowing greater harm could come to the infant if he/she accepts responsibility for the infant's care.

This is not to justify the nurse simply leaving and going home. In compliance with rule 217.11(1)(B) and the nurse's duty to maintain client safety as discussed in Position Statement 15.14 Duty of a Nurse in Any Setting, the expectation of the Board is that both the supervisor and staff nurse will work collaboratively to best meet the needs of all of the patients involved at the time of any given staffing crisis.

The Board of Nursing does not have jurisdiction in civil liability matters, so board staff cannot speak to civil liability concerns. A facility's legal counsel and/or risk management staff may be able to assist with development of nursing policies that comply with all applicable laws in the nurse's practice setting.
