Title XXI of the Social Security Act excludes certain categories of children, one of which is children with certain legal immigrant status. The Texas Legislature, 76th Session, enacted S.B. 445 (Health and Safety Code, Chapter 62.105) which authorized a non-entitlement health insurance benefit program for these children. These families have not met citizen/alien status requirements to qualify for other health programs. The processes and benefits for legal immigrant children are identical to those for other children in the CHIP program. However, unlike CHIP, the funding source is 100 percent State.

Funding for 2008-09 reflects projected 2008-09 caseload at projected FY 2008 rates. Projected expenditures for cost increases for FY 2009 are requested as an exceptional item. Provider rate restoration is also requested as an exceptional item.
