•Eligible individuals include*:

- U.S. Citizens
- Certain legally-admitted alien residents

•Federally Mandated Verification Requirements:

- States must verify alien status for individuals who are not U.S. citizens and
- States must verify citizenship and identity for individuals who claim U.S. citizenship

*Federal law mandates states to provide Medicaid reimbursement for otherwise eligible non-citizens who require emergency medical services meeting certain criteria.



Citizenship and Identity - Medicaid

Citizenship Verification

- The Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 requires that applicants for Medicaid must provide documentary evidence to establish both citizenship and identity. (Effective July 1, 2006)
 - Acceptable verification is prescribed in the law and through Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) guidance
 - Current recipients are grandfathered until their next review and then must provide proof
 - New requirement is delaying eligibility determination, and increasing workload



HHSC utilizes all available data sources to verify citizenship*:

- Current SSI recipients and individuals entitled to or enrolled in Medicare
- Births paid for by the Texas Medicaid program
- Texas Birth Certificate registry

*Under federal requirements may also need to also verify identity

For those individuals required to provide documentation, the following documents can be accepted to verify **<u>both</u> <u>citizenship and identity</u>** for the Medicaid program:

- U.S. passport
- Certificate of Naturalization
- Certificate of U.S. Citizenship

If another document is used to verify citizenship, must also provide proof of identity

 - States must verify citizenship if it is questionable
 - States must verify alien status for individuals who are not U.S. citizens
- •State Mandated Verification Requirements:
 - Verification of alien status is required for all persons claiming legal alien status



TANF Eligibility

- •Eligible individuals include:
 - U.S. Citizens
 - Certain legally-admitted alien residents
- •Federally Mandated Verification Requirements:
 - States must verify alien status for individuals who are not U.S. citizens
- •State Mandated Verification Requirements:
 - Verification of citizenship is required for all persons claiming U.S. citizenship
 - Verification of alien status is required for all persons claiming legal alien status



- •Eligible children include:
 - U.S. Citizens
 - Certain legally-admitted alien residents
- •State Mandated Verification Requirements:
 - Non-citizens must provide verification of immigration/alien status



For individuals who meet eligibility requirements and must prove legal alien status, documents are verified by HHSC using:

- Federal Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services (BCIS) Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) web-based application
- A manual verification through BCIS is available if information is unable to be verified through the SAVE system

Examples of Alien Status Documents

•I-94: Arrival Departure Record

- •I-688-B: Employment Authorization Card
- •I-766: Employment Authorization Document
- •I-551: "Green Card"
- •I-151 (only issued prior to 1978)
- •Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services Asylum office letter
- •Order from an immigration judge
- •Derivative T Visa Victim of severe trafficking and family members
- •Original certification letter from Office of Refugee Resettlement
