5. 2007-2010 Rule Review Plan for State Board for Educator Certification Rules

This item outlines the rule review plan for State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rules during the period of 2007 through 2010. Texas Government Code, §2001.039, requires a rule review of existing state agency rules, including SBEC rules. The rule review requirement is designed to ensure that the reason for initially adopting a rule continues to exist.

This item provides the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) an opportunity to discuss concerns raised by some State Board of Education (SBOE) members regarding language the SBEC approved for adoption, subject to SBOE review, for 19 TAC Chapter 249, <u>Disciplinary Proceedings, Sanctions, and Contested Cases</u>, Subchapter B, <u>Enforcement Actions and Guidelines</u>, §249.17, <u>Decision-Making Guidelines</u>, and Subchapter E, <u>Posthearing Matters</u>, §249.44, <u>Reapplication Following Denial, Surrender, or Revocation</u>, at the November 2007 SBEC meeting. The concerns relate to the permanent revocation of a teaching certificate and the timeline for reapplication when an application has been denied or a certificate has been surrendered or revoked.

7. Approval of Changes to 2007-2010 Rule Review Plan for State Board for Educator Certification Rules

The State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) will have an opportunity to discuss and approve changes to the 2007-2010 Rule Review Plan for SBEC Rules based on the need to accelerate the review of rules relating to educator preparation programs and to balance the remaining rule review workload. Texas Government Code, §2001.039, requires the rule review of state agency rules, including SBEC rules. The rule review requirement is designed to ensure that the reason for initially adopting a rule continues to exist.

8. Proposed Revisions to Board Operating Policies and Procedures (BOPP)

This item provides the Board an opportunity to approve changes requested at the Board retreat on May 19, 2007. The Board will also have an opportunity to consider other amendments to the BOPP, including changes to the public registration process.

9. Adoption of the Review of and Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 232, General Certification Provisions

Texas Government Code, §2001.039, establishes a four-year rule review cycle for all state agency rules, including State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rules. This item presents for SBEC consideration the adoption of the review of 19 TAC Chapter 232, <u>General Certification Provisions</u>. The rules under review provide requirements relating to types and classes of certificates issued, certificate renewal, and continuing professional education requirements.

This item also provides the SBEC an opportunity to approve proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 232, General Certification Provisions, as part of the statutorily-required review of existing rules. The proposed revisions would update the rules to reflect current law and add specificity to the requirements relating to types and classes of certificates issued, certificate renewal, and continuing professional education requirements.

10. <u>Adoption of the Review of and Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 233, Categories of Classroom Teaching Certificates.</u>

Texas Government Code, §2001.039, establishes a four-year rule review cycle for all state agency rules, including State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rules. This item presents for SBEC consideration the adoption of the review of 19 TAC Chapter 233, <u>Categories of Classroom Teaching Certificates</u>. The rules under review provide requirements relating to the standards for classroom teaching certificates and clarify the appropriate certification for specific assignment eligibility for the holders of the Early

Childhood-Grade 4, Early Childhood-Grade 6, Grades 4-8, Grades 8-12, and Early Childhood-Grade 12 certificates.

This item also provides the SBEC an opportunity to approve proposed amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 233, <u>Categories of Classroom Teaching Certificates</u>, as part of the statutorily-required review of existing rules. The proposed amendments would update the rules to reflect current law and clarify the appropriate certification for specific assignment eligibility for the holders of the Early Childhood-Grade 4, Early Childhood-Grade 6, Grades 4-8, Grades 8-12, and Early Childhood-Grade 12 certificates.
