

RECENT CHANGES IN THE FIREWORKS SECTIONS OF THE TEXAS OCCUPATIONS CODE CHAPTER 2154

September 18, 2007

Parts of HB 539, passed by the 80th Legislature this spring, took effect immediately. Other parts will take effect at a different times. The following is a brief synopsis of the bill. You should read and follow the bill in its entirety. The bill can be found on the web site at:

A major change in the code, prohibits the sale, after January 2, 2008, of certain pop rockets with a propellant casing length of less than five inches, an exterior diameter of less than three-fourths of an inch and an overall total rocket length of less than 26 inches. Sec. 2154.003.(d)

Another major change permits a retail fireworks permit holder to sell fireworks, directly to the public, beginning May 1 and ending May 5, if the location is within 100 miles of the Texas-Mexico border and is in a county in which the commissioners court has approved the sale during that period. Sec. 2154.202.(g)(3)

Other changes to the Texas Occupations Code initiated by HB539 that took effect immediately concern:

- adding a fire marshal to serve on the fireworks advisory council. Sec. 2154.054.(b) & (c)
- raising the age to 16 years of age to purchase fireworks. Sec. 2154.252.(c)
- establishing a minimum age of a person selling fireworks. Sec. 2154.254.(a) & (b) & (c)
- increasing the type of violations that constitute a Class C misdemeanor. Sec. 2154.303.(c)

HB 539 also changed portions of the Local Government Code Section 352, regarding the restriction of fireworks during drought conditions.
