#### LOCAL OPTIONS ELECTIONS

During 1939 there were 53 local option elections reported to the Liquor Control Board. Twenty-seven of these were county-wide, 25 were precinct elections and one was a town.

The county-wide elections were on seven different issues.

One county (Gaines) voted for legalizing beer.

Ten counties (Baylor, Burnet, Childress, Cooke, Hays, Houston, Lamb, Ochiltree, Yoakum and Young) voted against legalizing beer.

Six counties (Eastland, Leon, Rusk, San Augustine, Smith and Tyler) voted for prohibiting beer.

Four counties (Brazos, Freestone, Grayson and Titus) voted against prohibiting beer.

Three counties (Angelina, Cottle and Wood) voted against legalizing 14% beverages.

One county (Newton) voted for prohibiting all alcoholic beverages.

Two counties (Milam and Trinity) voted against prohibiting alcoholic beverages.

One of the 25 precinct elections was held void, and in another precinct election two issues were voted on.

Grayson County:	Grayson County voted (3623-3357) against prohibiting beer July 1.
Hays County:	Hays County voted (802-1516) against legalizing beer Feb. 11.
Houston County:	Houston County voted (469-1937) against legalizing beer Sept. 2.
Hutchinson County:	Precinct 4 (Holt, Plemons) voted (14-45) for prohibiting all alcoholic beverages May 27.  Precinct 3 (Gehwitt, Stinnett, Pringle) voted (119-109) against prohibiting alcoholic beverages June 24.
Jeff Davis County:	Precinct 2 (Newton, Limpia) voted (48-25) for legalizing beer May 27.

Lamar County: Precinct 4 (Blossom) voted (151-245) for prohibiting beer Sept. 30.

Lamb County: Lamb County voted (526-1216) against legalizing beer June 26.

Leon County: Leon County voted (515-984) for prohibiting beer April 8.

Marion County: Precinct 4 (Grange Hall, Hasty, Lodi) voted (69-41) against prohibiting alcoholic beverages.

Matagorda County: Precinct 8 (Markham, Clemville, Buckeye) voted (94-61) against prohibiting alcoholic beverages March 4. This election was held void.

Rusk County: Rusk County voted (1711-1801) for prohibiting beer Sept. 2.

San Augustine County: San Augustine County voted (691-729) for prohibiting beer Nov. 25.

Smith County: Precinct 5 (Lindale, Garden Valley, Swan Jamestown, Providence, Mount Sylvan) voted (101-659) against legalizing beer June 24.  
Smith County voted (2139-2537) for prohibiting beer Nov. 25.

Somervell County: Precinct 3 (Rainbow) voted (1-43) for prohibiting beer May 27.  
Precinct 4 (Buck Creek, George Creek) voted (27-63) for prohibiting beer Aug. 26.
