## LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were thirty-two local option elections held in 1950. Eleven were county wide, nineteen were justice precinct elections, and two were city elections.

The voting in 1950.

(Note: In the following tabulations the first figure denotes the "wet" total, the second figure the "dry" total.)

ANDREWS COUNTY: Andrews County voted on August 5, 1950, (188-753)

against legalizing the sale of malt and vinous beverages that do not contain alcohol in excess of four-

teen (14) per centum by volume.

BOWIE COUNTY: Bowie County voted on December 8, 1950, (5079 -

3155) to prohibit the sale of beer.

CARSON COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 6, Carson County, voted on

May 6, 1950, (123-134) to prohibit the sale of all

alcoholic beverages.

Justice Precinct No. 6, Carson County, voted on August 19, 1950, (93-123) against legalizing the sale of beer, and (91-125) against legalizing the sale of malt and vinous beverages that do not contain alcohol in excess of fourteen (14) per cen-

tum by volume.

CHAMBERS COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 5, Chambers County, voted

on January 31, 1950, (188-230) to prohibit the sale

of all alcoholic beverages.

This same Justice Precinct No. 5 voted on May 6,

1950, (304-283) to legalize the sale of beer.

CRANE COUNTY: Crane County voted on November 7, 1950, (645-456)

against prohibiting the sale of alcoholic beverages.

GRAY COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 5, Gray County, voted on

November 7, 1950, (174-521) against legalizing the sale of malt and vinous beverages that do not contain alcohol in excess of fourteen (14) per centum

by volume.

GREGG COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 5, Gregg County, voted on January 7, 1950, (56-131) against legalizing the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

HARDIN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 8, Hardin County, voted on October 7, 1950, (178-152) against prohibiting the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

HAYS COUNTY:

Hays County voted on July 8, 1950, (1442-2041) against legalizing the sale of malt and vinous beverages that do not contain alcohol in excess of fourteen (14) per centum by volume.

HARRIS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Harris County, voted on February 4, 1950, (7295-5829) against prohibiting the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

Jacinto City, Harris County, voted on February 4, 1950, (505-392) against prohibiting the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

South Houston, Harris County, voted on May 6, 1950, (436-314) against prohibiting the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

HOWARD COUNTY:

Howard County voted on November 1, 1950, (2860-2992) to prohibit the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

JIM WELLS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Jim Wells County, voted on November 7, 1950, (45-70) against legalizing the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

LIBERTY COUNTY:

Justice Frecinct No. 9, Liberty County, voted on July 8, 1950, (125-188) to prohibit the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

LIPSCOMB COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Lipscomb County, voted on November 7, 1950, (194-171) against prohibiting the sale of beer.

LUBBOCK COUNTY:

Lubbock County voted on August 5, 1950, (5484-9753) against legalizing the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

MARION COUNTY:

Marion County voted on May 2, 1950, (755-1532) against legalizing the sale of beer.

MATAGORDA COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Matagorda County, voted on March 17, 1950, (44-83) against legalizing the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

Justice Precinct No. 5, Matagorda County, voted on July 8, 1950, (282-84) against prohibiting the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

Justice Precinct No. 6, Matagorda County, voted on July 8, 1950, (59-88) against the legalizing the sale of beer.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY:

Montgomery County voted on September 7, 1950, (2667-2022) against prohibiting the sale of beer.

NUECES COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Nueces County, voted on May 6, 1950, (108-297) against legalizing the sale of malt and vinous beverages that do not contain alcohol in excess of fourteen (14) per centum by volume.

REAL COUNTY:

Real County voted on June 21, 1950, (216-544) against legalizing the sale of beer.

ROBERTSON COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Robertson County, voted on March II, 1950, (202-664) against legalizing the sale of beer.

SCURRY COUNTY:

Scurry County voted on May 6, 1950, (694-2479) against legalizing the sale of beer.

TOM GREEN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Tom Green County, voted on October 10, 1950, (224-168) against prohibiting the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

TRINITY COUNTY:

Trinity County voted on November 4, 1950, (1690-1677) against prohibiting the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

WILLACY COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Willacy County, voted on May 6, 1950, (89-160) against legalizing the sale of malt and vinous beverages that do not contain alcohol in excess of fourteen (14) per centum by volume.

Justice Precinct No. 5, Willacy County, voted on August 5, 1950, (78-80) to prohibit the sale of all alcoholic beverages.
