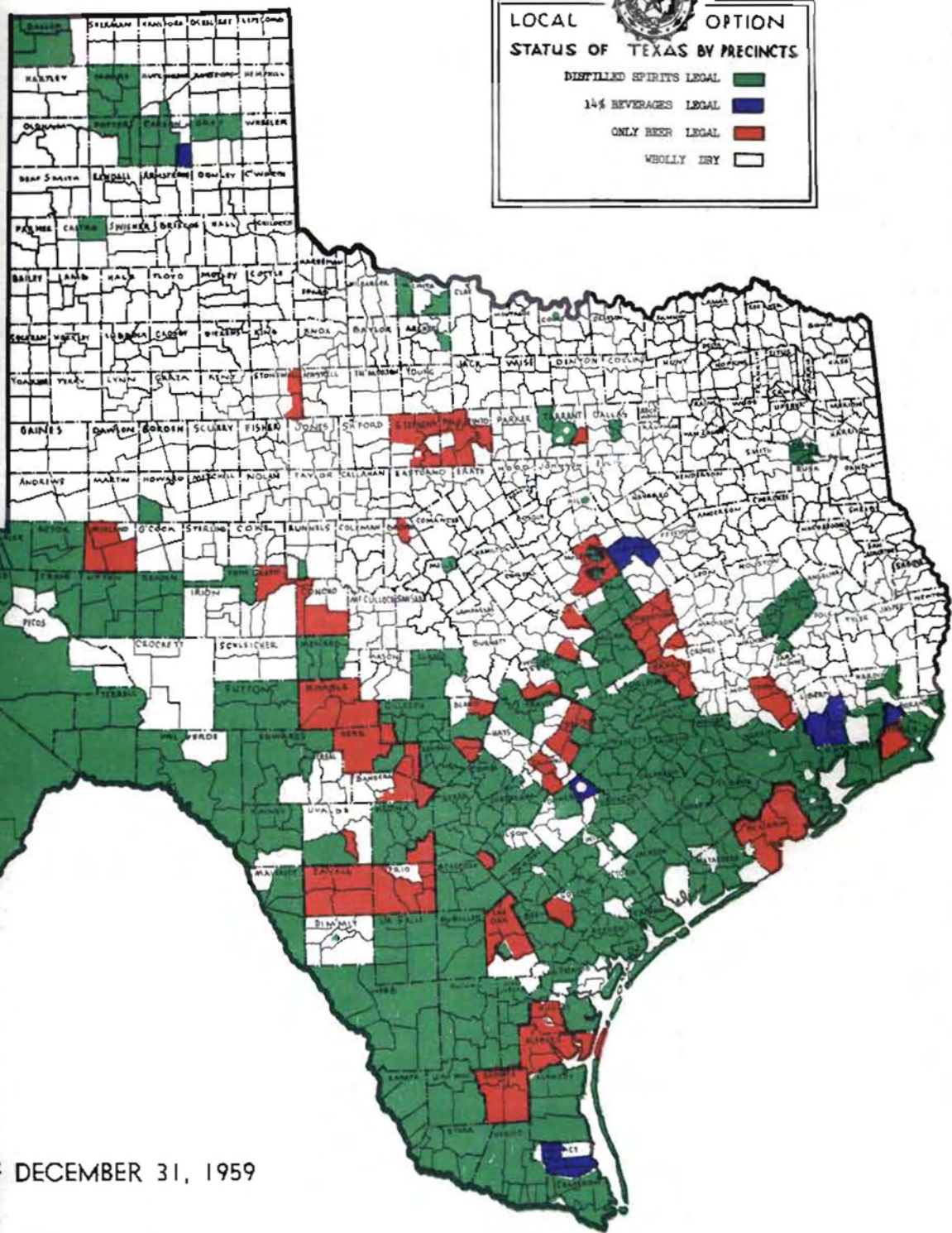

## LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty-four local option elections held in 1959. One was called to prohibit and became "dry". Twenty-one were called to legalize, eleven became "wet", ten remained "dry". Two "wet" for the sale of beer before election and both became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

The voting in 1959.

(Note: In the following tabulations the first figure denotes the "wet" total, and the second figure the "dry" total.)

### ARCHER COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Archer County, on November 7, 1959, voted 132 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 21 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

### BROWN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Brown County, on September 5, 1959, voted 446 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 207 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

### CASTRO COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Castro County, on October 10, 1959, voted 160 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 91 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

### CHAMBERS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 5, Chambers County, on June 6, 1959, voted 423 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 387 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

CHEROKEE COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Rusk, Cherokee County, on November 14, 1959, voted 256 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 526 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Rusk was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

COOKE COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Muenster, Cooke County, on September 5, 1959, voted 352 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 14 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Muenster was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

CORYELL COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Copperas Cove, Coryell County, on September 4, 1959, voted 107 for the legal sale of beer and 236 against the legal sale of beer. Copperas Cove was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

DICKENS COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Dickens, Dickens County, on October 10, 1959, voted 66 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 85 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Dickens was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

DIMMIT COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Asherton, Dimmit County, on October 10, 1959, voted 191 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 30 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Asherton was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

HARDIN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Hardin County, on July 11, 1959, voted 266 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 329 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HARDIN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Hardin County, on September 5, 1959, voted 162 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 295 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HILL COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Malone, Hill County, on September 5, 1959, voted 72 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 29 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Malone was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

LUBBOCK COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Lubbock County, on November 7, 1959, voted 808 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 898 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election and remained "dry".

MARION COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Marion County, on September 5, 1959, voted 58 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 115 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

MILLS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Mills County, on September 5, 1959, voted 112 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 27 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election and became "wet".

MC LENNAN COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of West, McLennan County, on October 10, 1959, voted 709 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 117 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. West was "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

The Incorporated City of Lacy-Lakeview, McLennan County, on December 5, 1959, voted 216 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 178 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Lacy-Lakeview was "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

NAVARRO COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Corsicana, Navarro County, on October 7, 1959, voted 1,033 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 1,946 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Corsicana was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

RUNNELS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 7, Runnels County, on September 5, 1959, voted 147 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 21 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

SAN JACINTO COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, San Jacinto County, on September 12, 1959, voted 97 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 61 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

Justice Precinct No. 2, San Jacinto County, on November 7, 1959, voted 200 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 328 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election and remained "dry".

STONEWALL COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Stonewall County, on November 7, 1959, voted 89 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 82 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election and became "wet".

TARRANT COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Forest Hill, Tarrant County, on September 9, 1959, voted 185 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 200 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Forest Hill was "wet" before the election was held and became "dry".

WALKER COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Walker County, on August 8, 1959, voted 109 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 206 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
