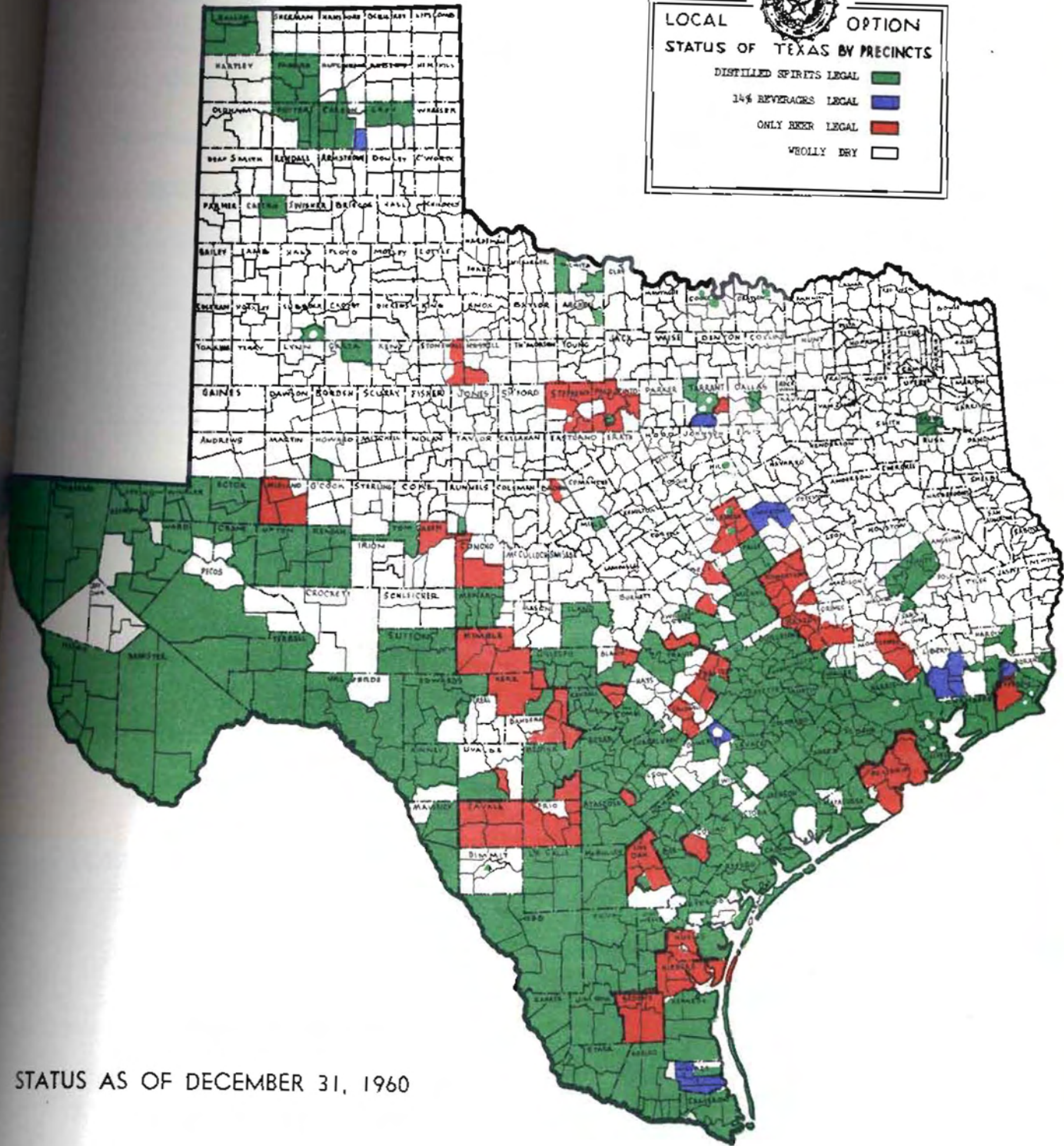

LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were thirty-five local option elections held in 1960. Thirty-four were called to legalize, eight became "wet", twenty-six remained "dry". One "wet" for sale of beer before election was held and became "wet" for sale of all alcoholic beverages.

The voting in 1960 is as follows:

- ANDREWS COUNTY: Andrews County, on July 9, 1960, voted 823 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 2,075 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This County was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
- CALHOUN COUNTY: The Incorporated City of Point Comfort, Calhoun County, on June 4, 1960, voted 189 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 235 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. Point Comfort was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
- Justice Precinct No. 3, Calhoun County, on July 9, 1960, voted 180 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 238 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
- COLEMAN COUNTY: The Incorporated City of Coleman, Coleman County, on April 9, 1960, voted 716 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 1,398 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Coleman was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
- COOKE COUNTY: The Incorporated City of Lindsay, Cooke County, on May 10, 1960, voted 75 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Lindsay was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

CORYELL COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 5, Coryell County, on August 6, 1960, voted 246 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 340 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of Copperas Cove, Coryell County, on November 5, 1960, voted 129 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 274 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. Copperas Cove was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

DALLAS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 7, Dallas County, on December 16, 1960, voted 13,768 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 22,439 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

DICKENS COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Dickens, Dickens County, on November 5, 1960, voted 85 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 89 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Dickens was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

ELLIS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Ellis County, on April 9, 1960, voted 1,561 for the legal sale of beer, and 1,977 against the legal sale of beer. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

GARZA COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Garza County, on April 9, 1960, voted 133 for the legal sale of alcoholic beverages and 123 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

Justice Precinct No. 4, Garza County, on April 9, 1960, voted 28 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 52 against the legal sale of alco-

holic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

GRAYSON COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Denison, Grayson County, on July 9, 1960, voted 2,620 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 2,550 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Denison was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

GRIMES COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Grimes County, on April 9, 1960, voted 833 for the legal sale of beer and 724 against the legal sale of beer. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

HARDIN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Hardin County, on July 9, 1960, voted 216 for the legal sale of beer and 385 against the legal sale of beer. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HASKELL COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Haskell County, on October 11, 1960, voted 153 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 118 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

HEMPHILL COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Hemphill County, on March 1, 1960, voted 31 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 50 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was dry before the election was held and remained "dry".

HOCKLEY COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Sundown, Hockley County, on August 6, 1960, voted 147 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 230 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Sundown was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HUNT COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Quinlan, Hunt County, on January 9, 1960, voted 44 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 127 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. Quinlan was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HUTCHINSON COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Sanford, Hutchinson County, on November 5, 1960, voted 19 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 66 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. Sanford was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

JONES COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Jones County, on May 7, 1960, voted 191 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 327 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

LIBERTY COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 5, Liberty County, on April 9, 1960, voted 42 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 167 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

LUBBOCK COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Slaton, Lubbock County, on November 5, 1960, voted 924 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 1,085 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Slaton was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

Justice Precinct No. 2, Lubbock County, on December 10, 1960, voted 1,260 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 1,054 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

MITCHELL COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Colorado City, Mitchell County, on December 10, 1960, voted 687 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 918 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Colorado City was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

MORRIS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Morris County, on May 7, 1960, voted 226 for the legal sale of alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 644 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

NOLAN COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Sweetwater, Nolan County, on October 6, 1960, voted 1,682 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 2,152 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Sweetwater was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

PALOPINTO COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Mingus, Palo Pinto County, on May 5, 1960, voted 112 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 25 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Mingus was "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

RED RIVER COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Red River County, on November 8, 1960, voted 77 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 93 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

SCURRY COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Snyder, Scurry County, on October 8, 1960, voted 1,281 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 1,965 against

the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Snyder was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

SOMERVELL COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 2, Somervell County, on March 5, 1960, voted 22 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 58 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

TARRANT COUNTY: The Incorporated City of Forest Hill, Tarrant County, on August 9, 1960, voted 235 for the legal sale of beer and 310 against the legal sale of beer. Forest Hill was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

Justice Precinct No. 7, Tarrant County, on September 10, 1960, voted 947 for the legal sale of beer and wine for off premise consumption only and 903 against the legal sale of beer and wine for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

WILLACY COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 7, Willacy County, on April 9, 1960, voted 33 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 8 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

Justice Precinct No. 5, Willacy County, on July 9, 1960, voted 33 for the legal sale of beer and wine, and 159 against the legal sale of beer and wine. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
