

LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were fifteen local option elections held in 1961. Thirteen were called to legalize, three became "wet", and eight remained "dry". One "wet" for sale of beer for off premise consumption only before election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for on and off premise consumption. Two elections were called to prohibit and both remained "wet".

The voting in 1961:

BELL COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Harker Heights, Bell County, on January 30, 1961, voted 40 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 11 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Harker Heights was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

BORDEN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 1, Borden County, on January 7, 1961, voted 62 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 125 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

BRAZOS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No.6, Brazos County, on October 7, 1961, voted 33 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 62 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

FALLS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, Falls County, on October 7, 1961, voted 230 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 119 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "wet" before the election was held and remained "wet".

GARZA COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Garza County, on July 8, 1961, voted 178 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 66 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "wet" before the election was held and remained "wet".

GRIMES COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 5, Grimes County, on March 11, 1961, voted 43 for the legal sale of beer and 78 against the legal sale of beer. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HASKELL COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Haskell County, on May 6, 1961, voted 146 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 87 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "wet" for the sale of beer for off premise consumption only before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only.

JEFF DAVIS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, Jeff Davis County, on May 6, 1961, voted 47 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 39 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

LLANO COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Llano County, on April 15, 1961, voted 76 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 177 against the legal sale of beerfor off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

MARION COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 6, Marion County, on July 8, 1961, voted 85 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 112 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

NOLAN COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Sweetwater, Nolan County, on July 7, 1961, voted 1,538 for the legal sale of beerfor off premise consumption only. Sweetwater was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

SAN AUGUSTINE COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, San Augustine County, on December 9, 1961, voted 48 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 298 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

SAN PATRICIO COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 5, San Patricio County, on May 6, 1961, voted 359 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 462 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

TAYLOR COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Impact, Taylor County, on September 18, 1961, voted 18 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 2 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Impact was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

The Incorporated City of Impact, Taylor County, on October 2, 1961, voted 17 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Impact was "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for on and off premise consumption.
