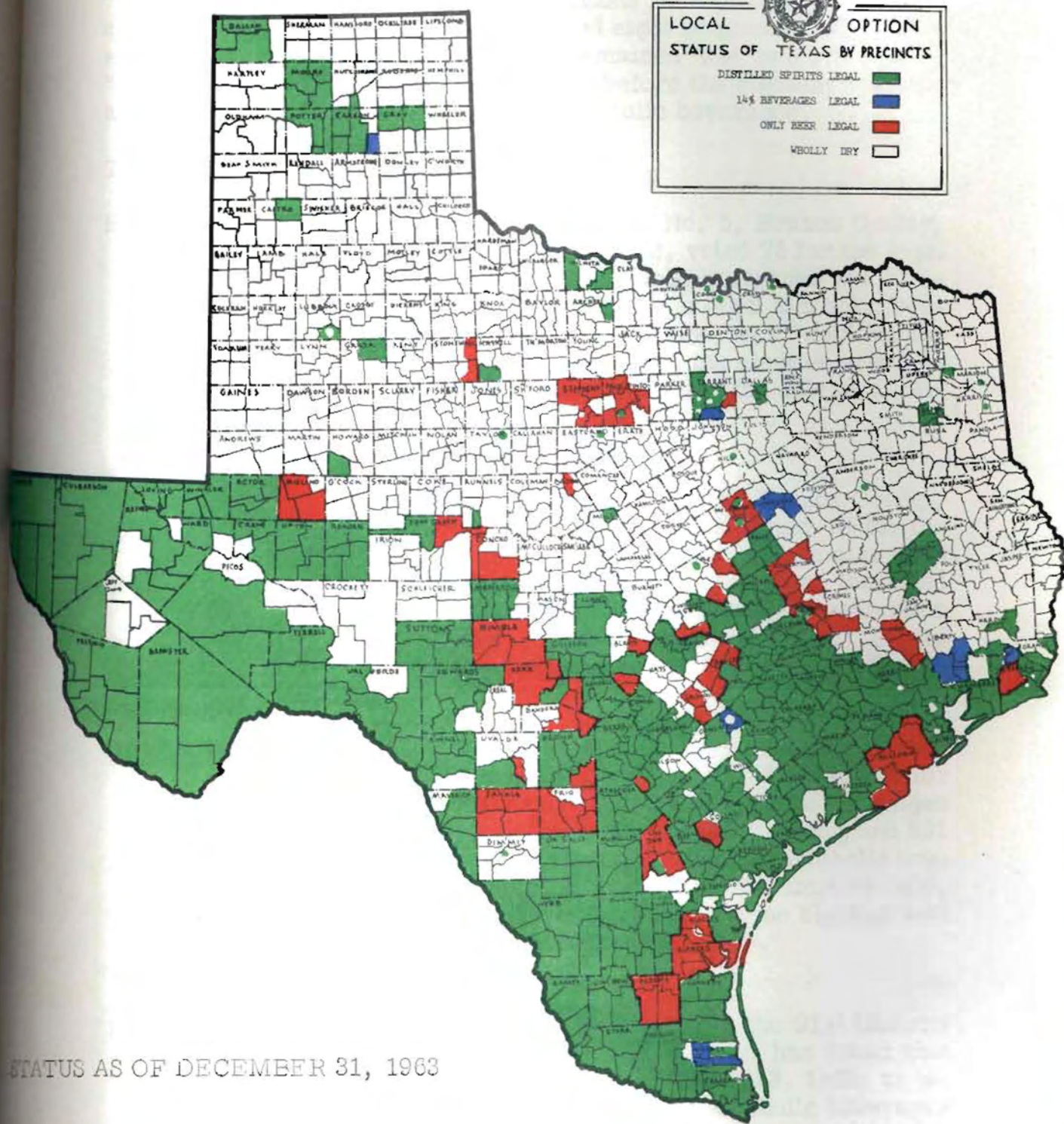

## LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were thirteen local option elections held in 1963. Ten were called to legalize, two became "wet" and eight remained "dry". Two elections were called to prohibit, one remained "wet" and one became "dry". One "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

The voting in 1963:

### BRAZOS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 5, Brazos County, on March 9, 1963, voted 75 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 67 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

Justice Precinct No. 6, Brazos County, on December 7, 1963, voted 73 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 63 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "wet" before the election was held and remained "wet".

### CALLAHAN COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Baird, Callahan County, on January 5, 1963, voted 230 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 391 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Baird was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

### EASTLAND COUNTY:

Judge T. M. Collie of the 91st District Court, Eastland County, has ruled that the election held March 23, 1963, to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only in the Incorporated City of Ranger, Eastland County, to be null and void.

The Incorporated City of Ranger, Eastland County, on July 20, 1963, voted 658 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 612 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Ranger was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

**GALVESTON COUNTY:**

The Incorporated City of Friendswood, Galveston County, on April 2, 1963, voted 17 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 219 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Friendswood was "wet" before the election was held and became "dry".

**HUTCHINSON COUNTY:**

The Incorporated City of Sanford, Hutchinson County, on September 21, 1963, voted 40 for the legal sale of beer and 52 against the legal sale of beer. Sanford was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

**LAMPASAS COUNTY:**

Justice Precinct No. 2, Lampasas County, on June 4, 1963, voted 26 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 61 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

**LIBERTY COUNTY:**

The Incorporated City of North Cleveland, Liberty County on September 4, 1963, voted 34 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 45 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. North Cleveland was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

- LIVE OAK COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 3, Live Oak County, on January 5, 1963, voted 45 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 103 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
- MARION COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 6, Marion County, on April 2, 1963, voted 71 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 142 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
- MATAGORDA COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 6, Matagorda County, on November 9, 1963, voted 92 for the legal sale of beer and 52 against the legal sale of beer. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".
- NUECES COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 6, Nueces County, on July 6, 1963, voted 536 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 1009 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
- UVALDE COUNTY: The Incorporated City of Sabin, Uvalde County, on April 6, 1963, voted 173 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 236 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Sabin was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
