## LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty-three local option elections held in 1964. Nineteen were called to legalize, five became "wet" and fourteen remained "dry". Two elections were called to prohibit, one remained "wet" and one became "dry". One "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages. One election to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages and remained "wet" for the sale of beer only.

The voting in 1964:

### BOWIE COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Leary, Bowie County, June 6, 1964, voted 48 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 69 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Leary was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

### BRAZOS COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 1, Brazos County, on March 7, 1964, voted 109 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 59 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

### CALHOUN COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Calhoun County, on June 6, 1964, voted 194 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 278 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

### CRANE COUNTY:

Crane County, on October 10, 1964, voted 710 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 537 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This county was "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages before the election was held and remained "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

DICKENS COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Dickens, Dickens County, on September 5, 1964, voted 90 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 88 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Dickens was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

DIMMIT COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Dimmit County, on March 7, 1964, voted 41 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 32 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

EASTLAND COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Gorman, Eastland County, on October 10, 1964, voted 91 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 401 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Gorman was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

GRAY COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Gray County, on October 10, 1964, voted 41 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 96 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

Justice Precinct No. 1, Gray County, on November 3, 1964, voted 237 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 271 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "wet" before the election was held and became "dry".

GRIMES COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Grimes County, on March 7, 1964, voted 192 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 127 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. This Precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

HUTCHINSON COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Sanford, Hutchinson County, on April 4, 1964, voted 51 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 74 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Sanford was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of Sanford, Hutchinson County, on June 6, 1964, voted 46 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 60 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Sanford was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

KAUFMAN COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Terrell, Kaufman County, on June 6, 1964, voted 1188 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 1420 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Terrell was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

LIPSCOMB COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 4, Lipscomb County, on July 2, 1964, voted 90 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 173 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

LIVE OAK COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 3, Live Oak County, on April 4, 1964, voted 73 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 108 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

MASON COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 1, Mason County, on August 11, 1964, voted 473 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 383 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

MCCULLOCH COUNTY:

Justice Precinct No. 2, McCulloch County, on December 5, 1964, voted 52 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 86 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

PALO PINTO COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Mineral Wells, Palo Pinto County, on October 8, 1964, voted 1170 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages and 1359 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages. Mineral Wells was "wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and remained "wet" for the sale of beer.

RUSK COUNTY:

The Incorporated City of Overton, Rusk County, on August 8, 1964, voted 210 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 500 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Overton was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

SAN PATRICIO COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 4, San Patricio County on June 6, 1964, voted 563 for the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only and 535 against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only. This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

SAN SABA COUNTY: Justice Precinct No. 1, San Saba County, on June 29, 1964, voted 631 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 741 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of San Saba, San Saba County, on September 5, 1964, voted 60 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 434 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. San Saba was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

TAYLOR COUNTY: The Incorporated City of Tuscola, Taylor County, on May 5, 1964, voted 66 for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only and 190 against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. Tuscola was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
