

LOCAL OPTION ELECTION

There were twenty-seven local option elections held in 1966. Twentythree were called to legalize, five became "wet" and eighteen remained "dry". Two elections were called to prohibit, one remained "wet" and one became "dry". One "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only before the election was held and remained "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only. One "wet" for the sale of beer and wine before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

The voting in 1966:

ATASCOSA COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Atascosa County, on June 10, 1966, voted 440 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 437 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

BURNET COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Marble Falls, Burnet County, on May 7, 1966, voted 239 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 376 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Marble Falls was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of Granite Shoals, Burnet County, on November 1, 1966, voted 60 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 48 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Granite Shoals was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

CALHOUN COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Calhoun County, on June 11, 1966, voted 72 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 70 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet". Justice Precinct No. 3, Calhoun County, on July 9, 1966, voted 148 "For the legal sale of beer" and 299 "Against the legal sale of beer". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

CHAMBERS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 7, Chambers County, on August 30, 1966, voted 351 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 178 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This precinct was "wet" for the sale of beer and wine before the election was held and became "wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages.

COCHRAN COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Cochran County, on August 2, 1966, voted 61 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 194 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

COLEMAN COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Coleman County, on March 12, 1966, voted 1,009 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,457 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of Coleman, Coleman County, on May 10, 1966, voted 1,032 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,255 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Coleman was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of Coleman, Coleman County, on September 3, 1966, voted 915 "For the legal sale of beer" and 1,132 "Against the legal sale of beer". Coleman was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

CORVELL COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Copperas Cove, Coryell County, on Decemter 10, 1966, voted 350 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 379 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Copperas Cove was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

DALLAS COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Woodland Hills, Dallas County, on September 10, 1966, voted 43 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 82 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Woodland Hills was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

DENTON COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Lake Dallas, Denton County, on April 9, 1966, voted 133 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 207 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". Lake Dallas was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of Lewisville, Denton County, on May 4, 1966, voted 324 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 794 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". Lewisville was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

Old Justice Precinct No. 2, Denton County, on June 4, 1966, voted 267 "For the legal sale of beer" and 363 "Against the legal sale of beer". This precinct was "wet" before the election was held and became "dry".

ERATH COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Dublin, Erath County, on April 9, 1966, voted 379 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 777 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Dublin was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

FISHER COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Roby, Fisher County, on June 4, 1966, voted 158 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 300 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Roby was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HAMILTON COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Hamilton County, on September 3, 1966, voted 70 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 86 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

HARRISON COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Marshall, Harrison County, on October 8, 1966, voted 2,496 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 2,198 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Marshall was "wet" before the election was held and remained "wet".

The Incorporated City of Marshall, Harrison County, on October 8, 1966, voted 2,033 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 2,310 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Since this election was called "to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages for on and off premise consumption" it remained "wet" "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only".

JEFF DAVIS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Jeff Davis County, on May 28, 1966, voted 52 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 26 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". This precinct was regarded as being "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

LA SALLE COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 3, La Salle County, on December 10, 1966, voted 26"For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 37 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This precinct was regarded as being "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

MAVERICK COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 5, Maverick County, on October 8, 1966, voted 62 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 143 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

SAN JACINTO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, San Jacinto County, on September 3, 1966, voted 73 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 40 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet".

Justice Precinct No. 7, San Jacinto County, on December 10, 1966, voted 54 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 92 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

TAYLOR COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Tye, Taylor County, on April 9, 1966, voted 64 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 181 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This precinct was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".

The Incorporated City of Lawn, Taylor County, on December 10, 1966, voted 62 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 112 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Lawn was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry".
