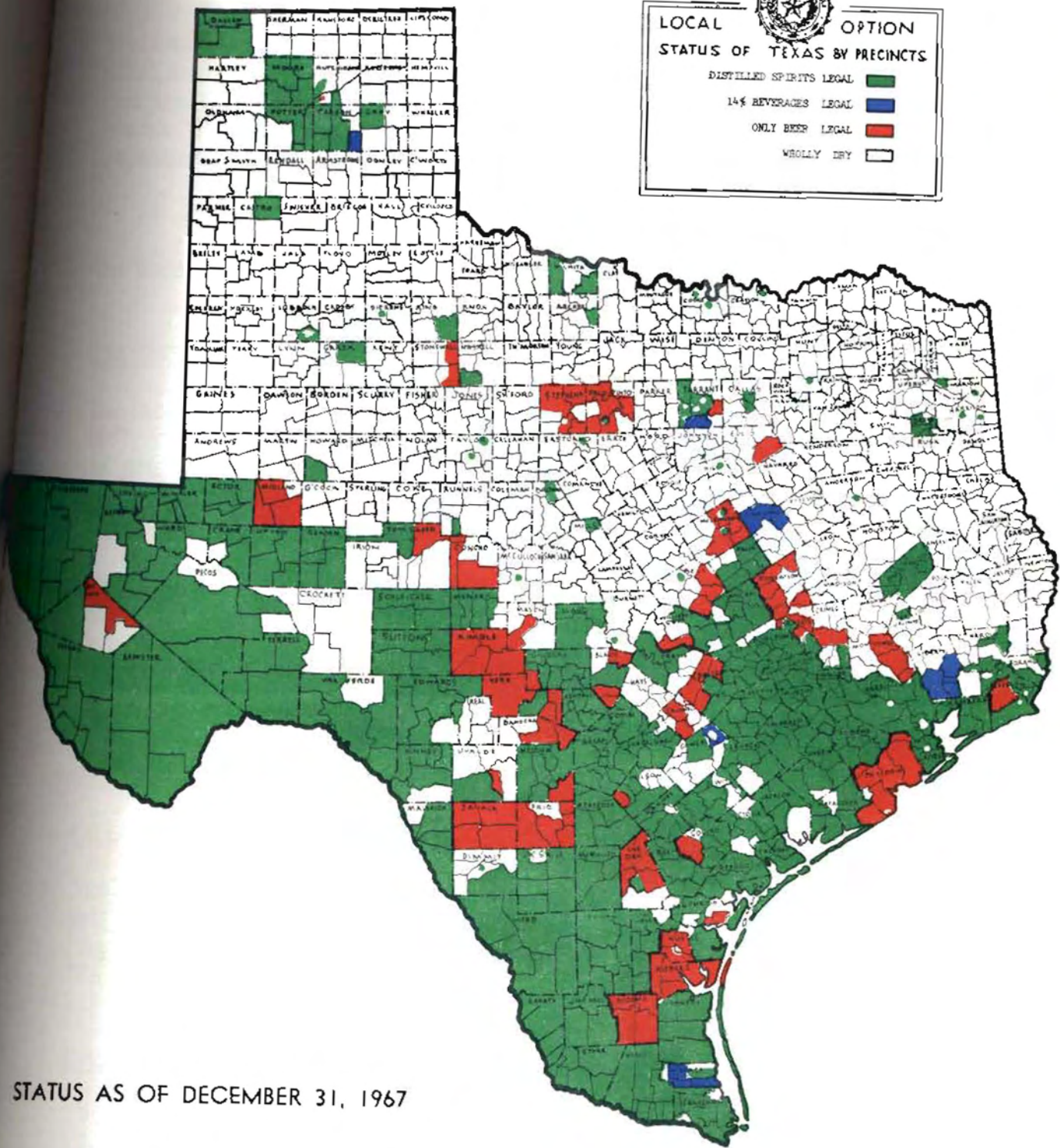

LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty local option elections held in 1967. Fourteen were called to legalize, three became "Wet" and eleven remained "Dry". Four elections were called to prohibit, three remained "Wet" and one became "Dry". Two elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages and all remained "Wet" for the sale of beer only.

The voting in 1967:

ANDERSON COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Palestine, Anderson County, on January 7, 1967, voted 2,308 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,808 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Palestine was "Wet" before the election was held and remained "Wet".

BRAZORIA COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Richwood, Brazoria County, on July 31, 1967, voted 102 "For the legal sale of beer" and 117 "Against the legal sale of beer". Richwood was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off premise consumption and became "Dry".

COLEMAN COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Coleman, Coleman County, on June 3, 1967, voted 766 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 1,027 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Coleman was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

DALLAS COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Balch Springs, Dallas County, on April 8, 1967, voted 431 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,049 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Balch Springs was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

DENTON COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Lake Dallas, Denton County, on April 8, 1967, voted 141 "For the legal sale of beer and wine for off premise consumption only" and 197 "Against the legal sale of beer and wine for off premise consumption only". Lake Dallas was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

DIMMIT COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, Dimmit County, on June 3, 1967, voted 22 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 22 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Wet" before the election was held and remained "Wet".

FRIO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 3, Frio County, on May 6, 1967, voted 74 "For the legal sale of beer" and 85 "Against the legal sale of beer". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

HUNT COUNTY

The Incorporated City of West Tawakoni, Hunt County, on March 11, 1967, voted 66 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 60 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". West Tawakoni was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

HUTCHINSON COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Hutchinson County, on April 22, 1967, voted 9 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 10 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

Justice Precinct No. 6, Hutchinson County, on June 17, 1967, voted 9 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 6 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

JEFF DAVIS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Jeff Davis County, on September 9, 1967, voted 20 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 32 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off premise consumption only before the election was held and remained "Wet" for the sale of beer for off premise consumption only.

LAMB COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Littlefield, Lamb County, on December 9, 1967, voted 745 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,106 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Littlefield was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

LUBBOCK COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Lubbock County, on January 14, 1967, voted 1,567 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,009 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Wet" before the election was held and remained "Wet".

MARION COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Marion County, on April 11, 1967, voted 110 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 220 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

NOLAN COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Sweetwater, Nolan County, on November 10, 1967, voted 1,570 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,755 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Sweetwater was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

PALO PINTO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 5, Palo Pinto County, on May 31, 1967, voted 1,257 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 1,783 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Wet" for the sale of beer before the election was held and remained "Wet" for the sale of beer.

RED RIVER COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Red River County, on May 6, 1967, voted 669 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 1,212 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

SAN JACINTO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, San Jacinto County, on February 4, 1967, voted 112 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 208 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

Justice Precinct No. 2, San Jacinto County, on May 6, 1967, voted 218 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 301 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

SCHLEICHER COUNTY

Schleicher County, on October 7, 1967, voted 358 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 350 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Schleicher County was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only.
