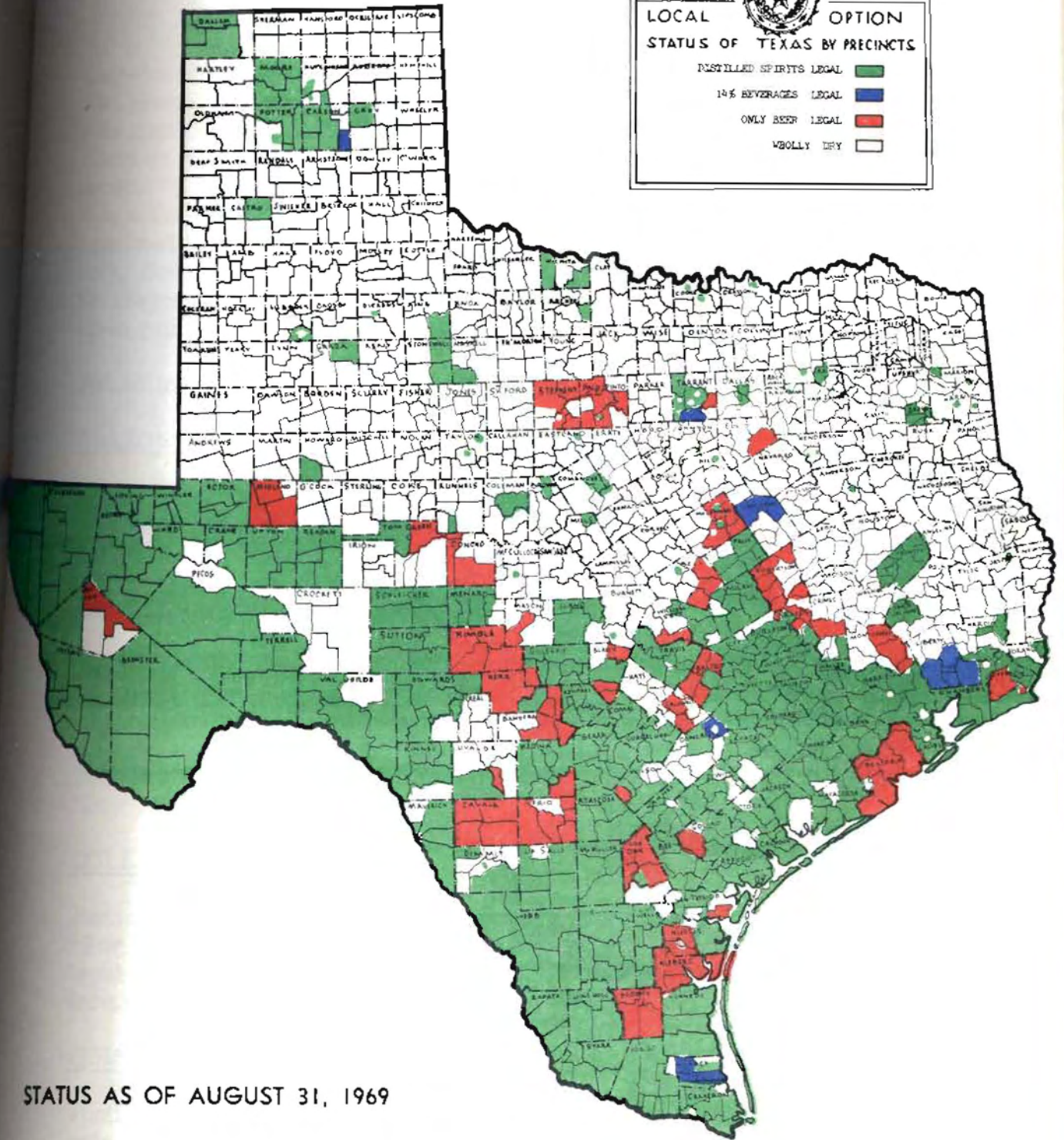

LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty-three local option elections during the fiscal year. Two elections were called to legalize the sale of beer for off premise consumption only; one became "Wet" and one remained "Dry". Two elections were called for the legal sale of beer; one was "Wet" and became "Dry" and one remained "Dry". Twelve elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages; six became "Wet", five remained "Dry", and one remained "Wet" for the legal sale of beer only. Seven elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only; four became "Wet" and three remained "Dry".

The voting for the fiscal year:

BRAZORIA COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Richwood, Brazoria County, on November 5, 1968, voted 191 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 144 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". Richwood was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

BURNET COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, Burnet County, on May 24, 1969, voted 515 "For the legal sale of beer" and 516 "Against the legal sale of beer". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

COLEMAN COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Coleman County, on June 7, 1969, voted 451 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 441 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

COMANCHE COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, Comanche County, on December 7, 1968, voted 82 "For the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only" and 92 "Against the legal sale of beer for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

Justice Precinct No. 1, Comanche County, on December 30, 1968, voted 486 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 989 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

Justice Precinct No. 4, Comanche County, on April 5, 1969, voted 128 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 117 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

HENDERSON COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Caney City, Henderson County, on January 25, 1969, voted 33 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 9 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". Caney City was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only.

The Incorporated City of Seven Points, Henderson County, on April 23, 1969, voted 46 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 27 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Seven Points was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

The Incorporated City of Tool, Henderson County, on June 28, 1969, voted 40 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 93 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Tool was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

JASPER COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Jasper County, on June 7, 1969, voted 138 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 225 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

The Incorporated City of Browndell, Jasper County, on March 5, 1969, voted 56 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 10 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Browndell was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

LIPSCOMB COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Higgins, Lipscomb County, on May 10, 1969, voted 62 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 177 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Higgins was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

LLANO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Llano County, on April 1, 1969, voted 130 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 206 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

MC LENNAN COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Woodway, McLennan County, on July 1, 1969, voted 373 "For the legal sale of beer" and 459 "Against the legal sale of beer". Woodway was "Wet" for the sale of beer only before the election was held and became "Dry".

MIDLAND COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 3, Midland County, on February 8, 1969, voted 282 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 583 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Wet" for the legal sale of beer only before the election was held and remained "Wet" for the legal sale of beer only.

POTTER COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 5, Potter County, on November 5, 1968, voted 442 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 209 "Against the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

REEVES COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Reeves County, on March 8, 1969, voted 40 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 30 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

SAN JACINTO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, San Jacinto County, on June 7, 1969, voted 168 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 143 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

SAN PATRICIO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 5, San Patricio County, on October 5, 1968, voted 292 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 582 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

SHELBY COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Timpson, Shelby County, on March 8, 1969, voted 192 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 303 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". Timpson was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

STONEWALL COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Stonewall County, on December 7, 1968, voted 71 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only" and 31 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only". This Precinct was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off premise consumption only before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off premise consumption only.

TRAVIS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Travis County, on November 5, 1968, voted 1825 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 832 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

VICTORIA COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Victoria County, on December 7, 1968, voted 179 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 245 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages". This Precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".
