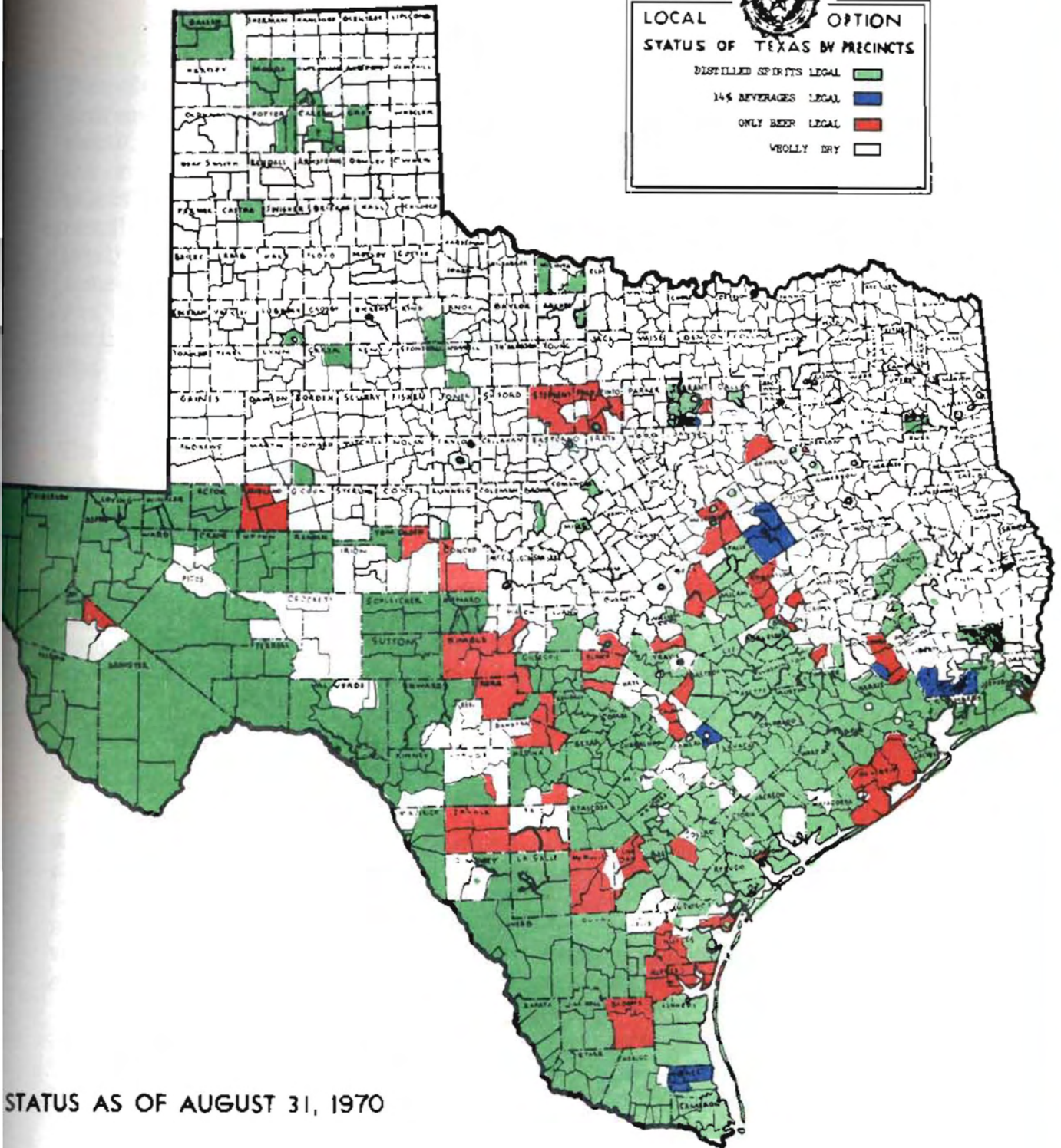

LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty-five local option elections during the fiscal year. Four elections were called to legalize the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only; one remained "Dry" and three became "Wet". Three elections were called to legalize the sale of beer; two remained "Dry" and one became "Wet". Eleven elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only; seven remained "Dry" and four became "Wet". Six elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages; two remained "Dry", one remained "Wet" for beer only, and three became "Wet". One election was called to legalize the sale of beer and wine. The area was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election and became "Wet" for the sale of beer and wine.

The voting for the fiscal year:

BRAZORIA COUNTY

The City of Bailey's Prairie, Brazoria County, on November 8, 1969, voted 18 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 66 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages." Bailey's Prairie was "Wet" for beer only before the election was held and remained "Wet" for beer only.

BURNET COUNTY

A newly annexed area to the City of Granite Shoals, Burnet County, on May 9, 1970, voted 104 "For the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 62 "Against the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." This area was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

Justice Precinct No. 4, Burnet County, on June 5, 1970, voted 576 "For the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 442 "Against the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

CHEROKEE COUNTY

The City of New Summerfield, Cherokee County, on July 7, 1970, voted 80 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 85 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." New Summerfield was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

DENTON COUNTY

The Incorporated City of Lincoln Park, Denton County, on June 2, 1970, voted 24 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 4 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

The City of Lake Dallas, Denton County, on August 8, 1970, voted 201 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 212 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Lake Dallas was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

GONZALES COUNTY

The City of Nixon, Gonzales County, on June 9, 1970, voted 238 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 275 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages." Nixon was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

HAYS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Hays County, on June 6, 1970, voted 1,562 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 1,288 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

HENDERSON COUNTY

The City of Gun Barrel, Henderson County, on September 29, 1969, voted 29 "For the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 11 "Against the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." Gun Barrel was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

The City of Coffee City, Henderson County, on February 2, 1970, voted 18 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 0 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Coffee City was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

HOOD COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 3, Hood County, on August 8, 1970, voted 95 "For the legal sale of beer" and 430 "Against the legal sale of beer." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

JASPER COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 5, Jasper County, on October 4, 1969, voted 103 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 57 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

JEFFERSON COUNTY

The City of Pear Ridge, Jefferson County, on July 7, 1970, voted 331 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 332 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Pear Ridge was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

LIBERTY COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 5, Liberty County, on May 9, 1970, voted 125 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 168 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

The City of Cleveland, Liberty County, on May 9, 1970, voted 713 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 743 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages." Cleveland was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

MC LENNAN COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, McLennan County, on September 6, 1969, voted 208 "For the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 340 "Against the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

MONTGOMERY COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Montgomery County, on December 30, 1969, voted 65 "For the legal sale of beer and wine" and 10 "Against the legal sale of beer and wine." This precinct was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of beer and wine.

OLDHAM COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 3, Oldham County, on March 7, 1970, voted 171 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 283 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

POLK COUNTY

The City of Seven Oaks, Polk County, on October 4, 1969, voted 38 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 20 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages." Seven Oaks was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

REFUGIO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Refugio County, on May 9, 1970, voted 72 "For the legal sale of beer" and 75 "Against the legal sale of beer." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

SABINE COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 3, Sabine County, on May 23, 1970, voted 192 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 221 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

SAN JACINTO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, San Jacinto County, on November 8, 1969, voted 205 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 255 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." This precinct was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election was held and remained "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

SAN PATRICIO COUNTY

The City of Gregory, San Patricio County, on August 15, 1970, voted 48 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 43 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Gregory was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

WARD COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Ward County, on July 18, 1970, voted 193 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages" and 118 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet".

WILSON COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 7, Wilson County, on April 4, 1970, voted 443 "For the legal sale of beer" and 251 "Against the legal sale of beer." This precinct was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of beer.
