LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty-nine local option elections during the fiscal year ending August 31, 1975. Eleven elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only: eight remained "Dry" and three became "Wet". Two elections were called to legalize the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only; one remained "Dry" and one became "Wet". Two elections were called to legalize the sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only; one remained "Dry" and one became "Wet". One election was called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages: this area became "Wet". Two elections were called to legalize the sale of mixed beverages; one remained "Dry" and one became "Wet". One election was called to legalize the sale of beer; this area became "Wet". Six elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages; three remained "Dry" and three became "Wet". One election was called to legalize the sale of beer and wine: this area became "Wet". One election was called to prohibit the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages; this area remained "Wet". One election was called to prohibit the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only; this area remained "Wet". One election was called to prohibit the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages; this area remained "Wet".

The voting for the fiscal year:

BURNET COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Burnet County on June 26, 1975 voted 403 "For prohibiting the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 826 "Against prohibiting the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 1 was "Wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election was held and remained "Wet".

COLEMAN COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Coleman County on May 5, 1975 voted 389 "For prohibiting the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages" and 615 "Against prohibiting the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages." Justice Precinct No. 1 was "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages before the election was held and remained "Wet".

DAWSON COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 3, Dawson County on March 7, 1975 voted 53 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 117 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 3 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

GAINES COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, Gaines County on August 13, 1975 voted 37 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 78 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 4 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

HAYS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 4, Hays County on May 24, 1975 voted 257 "For the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only" and 342 "Against the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 4 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

HEMPHILL COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Hemphill County on April 5, 1975 voted 75 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 121 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 1 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

HENDERSON COUNTY

Incorporated City of Berryville, Henderson County on September 7, 1974 voted 64 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for offpremise consumption only" and 59 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Berryville was "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

LLANO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Llano County on February 8, 1975 voted 105 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 8 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Justice Precinct No. 6 was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

MARTIN COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Martin County on November 5, 1974 voted 105 "For the legal sale of mixed beverages" and 202 "Against the legal sale of mixed beverages." Justice Precinct No. 2 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

MITCHELL COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Mitchell County on July 8, 1975 voted 142 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 292 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Justice Precinct No. 2 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

MONTGOMERY COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 2, Montgomery County on February 8, 1975 voted 621 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 760 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Justice Precinct No. 2 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

NAVARRO COUNTY

Town of Angus, Navarro County on August 9, 1975 voted 44 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 42 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The Town of Angus was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

City of Mustang, Navarro County on March 25, 1975 voted 20 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 0 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." City of Mustang was "Wet" for beer for off-premise consumption only before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

NUECES COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Nueces County on August 12, 1975 voted 940 "For prohibiting the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 1,220 "Against prohibiting the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Justice Precinct No. 6 was "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages before the election was held and remained "Wet".

ORANGE COUNTY

Incorporated City of Rose City, Orange County on November 9, 1974 voted 98 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 135 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Rose Citywas "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

POLK COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Polk County on April 5, 1975 voted 429 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 658 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 1 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

Justice Precinct No. 2, Polk County on February 8, 1975 voted 502 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 637 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 2 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

Incorporated Town of Seven Oaks, Polk County on March 8, 1975 voted 47 "For the legal sale of mixed beverages" and 9 "Against the legal sale of mixed beverages." Incorporated Town of Seven Oaks was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of mixed beverages.

RUNNELS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 6, Runnels County on November 11, 1974 voted 218 "For the legal sale of beer" and 81 "Against the legal sale of beer." Justice Precinct No. 6 was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of beer.

SAN JACINTO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 7, San Jacinto County on October 5, 1974 voted 54 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 162 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 7 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

SAN PATRICIO COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 8, San Patricio County on March 1, 1975 voted 376 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 243 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Justice Precinct No. 8 was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

City of Odem, San Patricio County on January 4, 1975 voted 170 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 272 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." City of Odem was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

TITUS COUNTY

Incorporated City of Monticello, Titus County on May 6, 1975 voted 14 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 0 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Monticello was "Wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption and became "Wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages after the election was held.

TRAVIS COUNTY

Justice Precinct No. 1, Travis County on June 7, 1975 voted 366 "For the legal sale of beer and wine" and 191 "Against the legal sale of beer and wine." Justice Precinct No. 1 was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of beer and wine.

UVALDE COUNTY

Incorporated City of Sabinal, Uvalde County on September 7, 1974 voted 149 "For the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 131 "Against the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." Sabinal was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

WALKER COUNTY

Town of Riverside, Walker County on November 9, 1974 voted 25 "For the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 59 "Against the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." Riverside was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

WILLACY COUNTY

City of Lyford, Willacy County on November 5, 1974 voted 135 "For the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only" and 103 "Against the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." Lyford was "Dry" before the election was held and became "Wet" for the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

Justice Precinct No. 6, Willacy County on November 5, 1974 voted 67 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 136 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Justice Precinct No. 6 was "Dry" before the election was held and remained "Dry".

WILLIAMSON COUNTY

City of Cedar Park, Williamson County on November 9, 1974 voted 111 "For the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages" and 64 "Against the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages." Cedar Park was "Wet" for beer only before the election was held and became "Wet" for all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages.
