LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty-three local option elections during the fiscal year ending August 31, 1984. Seven elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only; four remained "dry" and three became "wet." Two elections were called to legalize the sale of mixed beverages; both became "wet." Three elections were called to legalize the sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only; all remained "dry." Six elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages; one remained "dry" and five became "wet." One election was called to legalize the sale of beer for on-premise consumption; one remained "dry." Four elections were called to legalize the sale of beer for off-premise consumption only; all became "wet."

The voting for the fiscal year:

CHEROKEE COUNTY

City of Cuney, Cherokee County, on June 9, 1984, voted 55 for "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 23 against "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." City of Cuney, Cherokee County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only."

CLAY COUNTY

Precinct No. 2, Clay County, on December 20, 1983, voted 55 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 17 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 2, Clay County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

DALLAS COUNTY

City of Buckingham, Dallas County, on January 18, 1984, voted 55 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages, including mixed beverages" and 27 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages, including mixed beverages." City of Buckingham, Dallas County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages, including mixed beverages.

DEAF SMITH COUNTY

Precinct No. 1, Deaf Smith County, on April 7, 1984, voted 2,659 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 2,441 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 1, Deaf Smith County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

DIMITT COUNTY

Precinct No. 3, Dimmit County, on November 5, 1983, voted 49 for "the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only" and 62 against "the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 3, Dimmit County, was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

GLASSCOCK COUNTY

Precinct No. 1, Glasscock County, on June 5, 1984, voted 76 for "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 37 against "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 1, Glasscock County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

GRAYSON COUNTY

Precinct No. 8, Grayson County, on March 31, 1984, voted 677 for "the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only" and 804 against "the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 8, Grayson County, was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

Local Option Elections (continued)

HENDERSON COUNTY

City of Seven Points, Henderson County, on October 8, 1983, voted 37 for "the legal sale of mixed beverages" and 7 against "the legal sale of mixed beverages." City of Seven Points, Henderson County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of mixed beverages.

City of Seven Points, Henderson County, on April 28, 1984, voted 20 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages, including mixed beverages" and 49 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages, including mixed beverages." City of Seven Points, Henderson County, was "dry" for the sale of all alcoholic beverages before the election was held and remained "dry."

KLEBERG COUNTY

Precinct No. 3, Kleberg County, on August 4, 1984, voted 196 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 129 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Precinct No. 3, Kleberg County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

MARION COUNTY

Precinct No. 2, Marion County, on September 6, 1983, voted 202 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 247 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 2, Marion County, was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

MCMULLEN COUNTY

Precinct No. 3, McMullen County, on April 7, 1984, voted 28 for "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 8 against "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 3, McMullen County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

MEDINA COUNTY

Precinct No. 4, Medina County, on June 9, 1984, voted 266 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 231 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." Precinct No. 4, Medina County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

MILAM COUNTY

City of Milano, Milam County, on March 10, 1984, voted 46 for "the legal sale of beer for on-premise consumption" and 135 against "the legal sale of beer for on-premise consumption." City of Milano, Milam County, was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

Precinct No. 2, Milam County, on May 8, 1984, voted 161 for "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only" and 122 against "the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 2, Milam County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

NACOGDOCHES COUNTY

Precinct No. 4, Nacogdoches County, on August 4, 1984, voted 268 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 540 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 4, Nacogdoches County, was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

NAVARRO COUNTY

City of Navarro, Navarro County, on June 11, 1984, voted 18 for "the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only" and 51 against "the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." City of Navarro, Navarro County, was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

ORANGE COUNTY

City of Orange, Orange County, on August 11, 1984, voted 1,654 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 1,253 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." City of Orange, Orange County was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

Local Option Elections (concluded)

REEVES COUNTY

City of Balmorhea, Reeves County, on February 4, 1984, voted 81 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages" and 45 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." City of Balmorhea, Reeves County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

SAN SABA COUNTY

Precinct No. 3, San Saba County, on October 8, 1983, voted 74 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 179 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 3 was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

STONEWALL COUNTY

Precinct No. 4, Stonewall County, on August 4, 1984, voted 44 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 47 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption." Precinct No. 4, Stonewall County, was "dry" before the election was held and remained "dry."

TOM GREEN COUNTY

City of San Angelo, Tom Green County, on November 8, 1983, voted 11,098 for "the legal sale of mixed beverages" and 6,032 against "the legal sale of mixed beverages." City of San Angelo, Tom Green County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of mixed beverages.

WILBARGER COUNTY

Precinct No. 3, Wilbarger County, on November 19, 1983, voted 140 for "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only" and 133 against "the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." Precinct No. 3, Wilbarger County, was "dry" before the election was held and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.
