ADDENDUM F. LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS

There were twenty local option elections during the fiscal year ending August 31, 1993. Three elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages; two remained "dry," and one became "wet." Seven elections were called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only; three remained "dry," and four became "wet." Six elections were called to legalize the sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only; five remained "dry," and one became "wet." Two elections were held to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages; two remained "dry." One election was called to legalize the sale of beer and wine; one remained "dry." One election was called to legalize the sale of mixed drinks; one became "wet."

The voting for the fiscal year:

BAILEY COUNTY

A local option election was held on January 5, 1993, in Justice Precinct 4, Bailey County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." The issue failed by a vote of 157 FOR and 199 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 4, Bailey County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

DEAF SMITH COUNTY

A local option election was held on January 12, 1993, in Justice Precinct 1, Deaf Smith County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The issue passed by a vote of 2,158 FOR and 2,038 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 4, was "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only before the election and remains "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

GARZA COUNTY

A local option election was held on October 5, 1992, in Justice Precinct 4, Garza County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." The issue passed by a vote of 24 FOR and 11 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 4, Garza County was "dry" before the election and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

GRAYSON COUNTY

A local option election was held on January 30, 1993, in the City of Southmayd, Grayson County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 102 FOR and 138 AGAINST. The City of Southmayd, Grayson County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

HAYS COUNTY

A local option election was held on April 3, 1993, in the City of Dripping Springs, Hays County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 156 FOR and 161 AGAINST. The City of Dripping Springs, Hays County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

HENDERSON COUNTY

A local option election was held on May 1, 1993, in the City of Caney City, Henderson County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages." The issue failed by a vote of 21 FOR and 23 AGAINST. The City of Caney City, Henderson County, was "dry" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages before the election and remains "dry."

HENDERSON COUNTY

A local option election was held on March 15, 1993, in the City of Gun Barrel, Henderson County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The issue passed by a vote of 91 FOR and 15 AGAINST. The City of Gun Barrel, Henderson County, became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

HOPKINS COUNTY

A local option election was held on July 10, 1993, in the City of Como, Hopkins County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 96 FOR and 130 AGAINST. The City of Como, Hopkins County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

LUBBOCK COUNTY

A local option election was held on January 23, 1993, in Justice Precinct 3, Lubbock County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 374 FOR and 674 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 3, Lubbock County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

LUBBOCK COUNTY

A local option election was held on May 8, 1993, in Justice Precinct 6, Lubbock County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine." The issue failed by a vote of 835 FOR and 880 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 6, Lubbock County, was "wet" for the legal sale of mixed beverages only and remains "wet" for the legal sale of mixed beverages only.

MITCHELL COUNTY

A local option election was held on September 8, 1992, in former Justice Precinct 2, Mitchell County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The issue passed by a vote of 66 FOR and 55 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 2 became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

PARKER COUNTY

A local option election was held on October 10, 1992, in the City of Hudson Oaks, Parker County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The issue passed by a vote of 129 FOR and 100 AGAINST. The City of Hudson Oaks, Parker County, was "dry" before the election and became "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.

PARKER COUNTY

A local option election was held on January 16, 1993, in Justice Precinct 1, Parker County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 777 FOR and 893 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 1, Parker remains "dry" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverage for off-premise consumption only.

POLK COUNTY

A local option election was held on September 18, 1992, in the City of Goodrich, Polk County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 47 FOR and 60 AGAINST. The City of Goodrich, Polk County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

RUNNELS COUNTY

A local option election was held on October 30, 1992, in the City of Winters, Runnels County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 316 FOR and 367 AGAINST. The City of Winters, Runnels County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

SAN JACINTO COUNTY

A local option election was held on August 7, 1993, in Justice Precinct 1, San Jacinto County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." The issue failed by a vote of 178 FOR and 204 AGAINST. Justice Precinct 1, San Jacinto County, was "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only before the election and remains "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverage for off-premise consumption only.

TARRANT COUNTY

A local option election was held on August 28, 1993, in the City of Grapevine, Tarrant County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 323 FOR and 593 AGAINST. The City of Grapevine, Tarrant County, was "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election and remains "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.

TARRANT COUNTY

A local option election was held on March 27, 1993, in the City of Keller, Tarrant County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off off-premise consumption only." The issued passed by a vote of 1935 FOR and 1457 AGAINST. The City of Keller, Tarrant County, was "dry" before the election and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only.

UNAUDITED

TARRANT COUNTY

A local option election was held on March 27, 1993, in the City of Keller, Tarrant County, for the issue of "The legal sale of mixed drinks." The issued passed by a vote of 1906 FOR and 1463 AGAINST. The City of Keller, Tarrant County, was "dry" before the election and became "wet" for the legal sale of mixed beverages.

WISE COUNTY

A local option election was held on June 5, 1993, in the City of Lake Bridgeport, Wise County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages except mixed beverages." The issue failed by a vote of 36 FOR and 49 AGAINST. The City of Lake Bridgeport, Wise County, was "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only before the election and remains "wet" for the legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only.
