### ADDENDUM F

# Local Option Elections

There were five local option elections during the fiscal year ending August 31, 1995. Four elections were called to legalize the sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only. One was called to legalize the sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages. As a result of these elections one jurisdiction remained "wet," three jurisdictions became "wet," and one jurisdiction remained "dry."

The voting for the fiscal year:

### **BASTROP COUNTY**

A local option election was held on May 6, 1995, in the City of Elgin, Bastrop County, for the issue of "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages." The issue passed by a vote of 326 FOR and 198 AGAINST. The City of Elgin, Bastrop County, was "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages before the election and remains "wet" for the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

#### **BROWN COUNTY**

A local option election was held on December 10, 1994, in the City of Early, Brown County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue passed by a vote of 467 FOR and 155 AGAINST. The City of Early, Brown County, was "dry" before the election and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only.

#### **ELLIS COUNTY**

A local option election was held on September 3, 1994, in the City of Maypearl, Ellis County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue failed by a vote of 48 FOR and 170 AGAINST. The City of Maypearl, Ellis County, was "dry" before the election and remains "dry."

#### HILL COUNTY

A local option election was held on April 22, 1995, in the City of Itasca, Hill County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue passed by a vote of 71 FOR and 4 AGAINST. The City of Itasca, Hill County, was "dry" before the election and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only.

#### NAVARRO COUNTY

A local option election was held on April 8, 1995, in the City of Richland, Navarro County, for the issue of "The legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only." The issue passed by a vote of 86 FOR and 32 AGAINST. The City of Richland, Navarro County, was "dry" before the election and became "wet" for the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only.
