- 23 polygraph examiners from the Department of Public Safety to the
- 24 Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation as provided by this
- 25 Act. The memorandum must include a transition plan with a timetable
- 26 with specific steps and deadlines needed to complete the transfer.
- 27 SECTION 31. This Act takes effect immediately if it

- 1 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 2 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 3 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 4 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
